The undersigned your petitioner respectfully represents unto your Honor that he is the owner and in possession of the Chapman's of lands called Healia Halaaua & Kamarikawa situated in the district of Puna Island of Hawaii, that the same was not awarded to him by the Land Commission, patented or conveyed by deed from his majesty the King by boundaries described in such award patent or deed and therefore upon your petition makes this application to your Honor to have the boundaries of said land decided and certified to, in accordance with the provisions of the act entitled "An Act to regulate the settlement of boundaries &c &c approved March 1868." And in furtherance of this application represents that the said lands of Healia situated as aforesaid adjoin the land called Chapman owned by the Commissioner of Crown Lands and also adjoining the Government lands called Kamarikawa and is under the supervision and control of his Excellency W. Hutchison, H. M. Minister of the Interior and said land is now fully described in the annexed copy survey.

Thereupon appointed the 5<sup>th</sup> day of November A.D. 1870  
for the hearing of said application, and according to law notified the commissioners of Crown and Government lands.

Court opened at Healia 9 AM

The parties appeared and declared themselves ready for trial.

After the hearing of the several witnesses the court gave decision in the matter as follows:-

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Boundaries of Heleia according to decision  
made on the 5<sup>th</sup> day of December 1870.

Commencing at the sea, at the SE corner of this land, at such a low water mark, called Matua which point is in a straight line with the Northwesterly side of Waipao River before it turns previous to entering the sea, and bearing North 83° West, to high rocky point called Pehahapele. From the above point following the sea to the small stream of water on Huanakumu and thence passing up and around the boundaries of the land called Kuanakumu by the following bearings & distances N. 78° W. 35' chains. N. 72° west 43 chains N. 71° 30' W. 13 chains. N. 82° 30' W. 10 chains N. 65° W. 17 chains. N. 50° W. 9 chains N. 44° 30' W. 8 chains N. 74° W. 28' from chains S. 86° East 31 chains S. 82° 30' 30 chains S. 71° 30' 42' from chain S. 67° 30' 17 chains S. 76° E. 6 chains S. 67° 30' 6 1/2 chains & S. 80° W. to the sea. At the North East corner of Huanakumu from thence, following the sea to a stream on the South Bank at the entrance into the sea of the small stream or river of Hamanalo, which is the North East corner of land called Hoimakaua. From the above point the Northwesterly Boundary of these lands runs N. 84° W. 768 feet, along near S side of Hamanalo River & S. 79° W. 1220 feet to top edge of a certain hill thence N. 86° W. 568 feet along said edge of Pali bounding Hamanalo gulch on the south, thence N. 72° W. 500 feet along or top of ridge separating Hoimakaua and Hamanalo gulch hence N. 70° West 935 feet passing along near North side of Heleia land and from thence always following along near the North side of the Heleia awai bearing and distances as follows. said stream S 76° W 600 feet, thence S 86° W 171 feet + S 81° W 1050 feet, following along said mountain road to the entrance of said road into the forest, thence following along said mountain road up along the top of the ridge boundary Heleia River on the North as follows, H 15° W 1055 feet S 76° W 475 feet N 72° W 500 feet to a clearing on the ridge called Peahukuhapai from thence N 83° W 5100 feet passing along near tops of ridge bounding Heleia Valley on its North side to the extreme North west corner of these lands.

The Boundary on the South side, commencing upon the sea, at the South East corner of these lands at the place called Waileia, runs S. 75° W 1061 feet crossing sand spit to Kapaia river and up along north side of said river in all its turns and meanders by the following bearings & distances S 75° 30' West 500 feet N 65° 30' W 279 feet N 8° W 680 feet N 42° 30' E 269 feet N 18° E 260 feet N 36° 30' W 243 feet N 72° W 364 feet S 77° 30' W 400 feet S 54° W 765 feet N 67° 30' W 1372 feet N 65° 30' 354 feet N 44° W 1300 feet N 81° W 149 feet N 42° W 660 S 74° W 350 feet, crossing the stream called Makoli, thence S 36° W, 150 feet N 63° W 200 feet, N 64° W 131 feet N 65° W 470 feet, thence passing up through the middle of the river S 74° W 1100 feet to a Kula tree on North side of the river, near mouth of the crossing of the highway road, thence S 57° W 2038 feet over Kula and S 34° W 978 feet to the middle of Kapaia river, from thence up through the Middle of Kapaia River N 67° W 4480 feet + N 73° to the Lapa or Ridge at junction of Kapaia + Heleia River from thence following up on middle of said Ridge N 77° 30' W 220 feet N 44° W 600 feet N 10° 30' W 589 feet N 30° 30' 323 feet, N 32° W 324 feet, N 28° W 263 feet N 85° W 289 feet S 56° W 225 feet S 57° 30' W 875 feet S 68° 30' W 445 feet to an open clearing, thence N 77° 30' W to top of Ridge bounding Minomiu valley on the south, from thence following along marka on top of said ridge to bluff, when said ridge runs southerly called Pealawi, thence following along top of said ridge bounding Minomiu on the south and Heleia Valley, passing over Mountain peak called Hape to the swamp, tall, rocky peak called Peahukuhapai, from thence following along on Pali bounding Heleia Valley on the south about 500 feet, to a ridge on Makai's side of a deep gulch running down into Heleia Valley from thence following down said ridge and crossing Heleia river and valley to the North west corner of these lands.
