Thereupon appointed the 12 day of November at 10 am for the hearing of said petition at Koula House Hanapepe. The petitioner appeared and called the following witnesses

My name is Kuapuu live in Koula
know him know boundary of Koula. Kahunawone told me
he was born and die on the land. This boundary commences
at a pole near stream called Kalapsunahai and thence over
stream and along Kala's patches to a stone called Kahunawone

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Thence up and around by Kahakua to a peak joining Wehiawa at
 a peak called Puaa thence to a hill called Puuwaikua, thence
 across gulch to Keapaloa, thence to Puuwanahu, thence along ridge
 and cliffs above falls to a place called Wailima
 thence to a gulch at junction with Manawahi called Olouauehi
 thence to Manua, thence to an old Heau Moloku, thence to
 Puukuaumi, thence down ridge to Puukuaui, thence to Puu-
 kuauai, thence to Puukuaui, thence to Puukuaui thence

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Thru up ridge to a point on the Maikawale range called Puuheua which terminates the western boundary of this land. From Puuheua, the N & N.E boundary runs down and along, a well defined ridge, to Wailima, and thence along same ridge to Puuowahae. Thence along ridge to Kapaloa. Thence along ridge Huluu, thence to and across gulch Kapalike to a point or hill called Puuoukai thence down ridge to a small round rise called Puuoukaikai where the boundary of this land, joins that of H. B. Rowell thence down along said Rowell's land to a rock on ridge of path above ~~the~~ and south of Koula house called Papakaia thence down to a split stone near said house called Kahumani, and thence across Koula stream and around corner of stone wall enclosing Koula patches to place of commencement

Notes of Survey of Koula in Hanapepe

The South West corner of this land commences at the junction of the Koula and Manuahi streams from whence the western boundary of the land runs along the land of Manuahi on the following notes

 beyond this the land is rough and thickly wooded but by the
 following description and reference to accompanying plan, at
 any future place times the boundary by survey can be more def-
 initely stated, the boundary from 2200 links ^{thence} round the
 side of range above the peaks to the south end of the Kalae
 ridge thence along the water shed of Kalae ridge to its north
 end thence N down to the S.W. side of stream, and then continuing
 up the west bank of stream to Hoalulu Waterfall, thence along
 west bank of stream to a place called Oloukawai from thence
 up a ridge leading to the top of Peulihua the North end of Manu-
 ahi. Thence following along the ridge in a W.E. direction toward
Waialeale to where a ridge branches off and runs in a S.E. direc-
 tion towards Kalae from thence in about a S.E. direction to a
 round hill in the saddle called Waialeale thence in a S.E. direction
 along ridge to Puuamau. Thence along ridge to a high
 sharp peak called Kapolea which is the W.W. corner of Wahua-
 awa and N.E. corner of this land.

Return to place of commencement the eastern boundary
 of this land runs thence S 39.25 E 354 links across the Koula
 stream to a large flat stone at the point of the Koula house
 and called Kahumau, thence S 62.45 E 450 links to the
 of rocky point called Papaheia, thence N 55.25 E 367 links

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along ridge, thence N 84. 59 E. 66.5 links up ridge to McRowell's
land thence N 26. 10 E 42.00 along the foot of hill to a point
called Wahawai N 89. E 47.00 links up the hill to the top of
Puuaukai bounded on the south by McRowell's land, thence
N 17. 45 E 32.00 to the top of Puuaukai bounded on the east
by Wahawai, thence N 38. 30 E 120.00 links to the top of a
spike on ridge called Hulea thence N 44. 45 E 70.00 links
to the top of a sharp spike at the N W corner of Wahawai
and called Kapooa, which is the NE corner of this land
From Puuaukai, the boundary between this
land and Wahawai is the watershed of the ridge (see plan)
