In accordance with an act passed and approved in the 23rd June 1868 relating to the settlement of boundaries I now make application to you to define and settle the boundary of the Ali of Oelele belonging to the Estate of his late Majesty Kamehameha V situated in the Chiefsdom of Hanalei in the Island of Hawaii

Thereupon appointed the 23rd day of November A.D. 1873 for the hearing of said petition, and notified the leasees together with the leasees of Hanalei and Samoa Gay acting for the crown of the time and place of hearing

Decision

Commences at a rocky point on the sea shore at the junction
of the Keulow boundary and called Kupahili and thence
Maheka along the Hanapepe river and boundary of Keulow
to a place on the river banks called Palomo, thence turning
East to an old Auwai, that formerly led to a fish pond
Kealoan, thence through rice fields to a hole in the side of
the pale called Nihouawai, thence up in a straight line to top
of ridge and Maheka along ridge to Vanahua, thence continuing
along top of ridge and pale to opposite and down to a large
hole in side of cliff called Heana, thence to an old Heana
where this boundary again joins the Maheka or WE corner
of Keulow at a place called Kalua where there is a large
pocket of India tree, thence across the Hanapepe river to
Kaitiiti, thence up along the old bed of river to loi Pua-
hau, thence to Kuhumu, thence to ridge of stones across river called
Waipua thence to head of Auwai of Elele at a place called Akeshi
Thence up face of high cliff to top of ridge and along ridge
and pale to Rowells stone wall, and following said stone wall
to junction with the boundary of Wahiana, thence Maheka along
the wahiana boundary in all its windings and turnings to a
rocky point on the sea shore called Kenakua and then
West along sea shore to Kupahili the place of commencement

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Boundary of the Ill of Eleele

Notes of Survey of the Land of Eleele on the SE Corner of the Ahupua'a of Hanalei

The SE corner of this land commences at the SW corner of Wahiawa at a place called Kewakua on the sea shore where the rock forms an arch through which the sea rushes. The boundary runs thence N 27.48 E 2075 links to the centre of a pile of stones under which there is a kind of cave or tunnel at 95 links on this line from the top of the cliff there is a flat and a long stone set into the ground, and from thence the following places bear N 4.43.6
 Ahuelehu Peak Δ on the boundary of Hanalei and Wahiawa N 32.23 W on Puuhapala N 16.12 W on Puualani Peak Δ N 27.52 E on Pohakua Peak Δ on the boundary of Wahiawa and Hanalei
 The boundary continued from 2075 N 16.39 E 1847 links to centre of large pile of stones, at 890 links on this line close to Makai side of road there are three stones set into the ground there - - - on the line N 30.36 E 1410 links to place about 150 links from the top of the pile (3) stones set into the ground thence N 36.53 E 903.5 links to three stones set into the ground there \therefore outside of old stone wall forming a kind of circle and in area about $\frac{1}{2}$ acre there is to the East a clump of cactuses or Papafou bushes, thence N 47.23 E 5676 links to makai side of Government road adjoining McRowell's land at stone fence which forms the NE corner of this land. Thence following along stone wall S 87.34 W 470 links. Thence S 77.33 W 323 links. Thence (S 74.33 W 567 links S 73.40 W 1232 links. Thence S 74.33 W 567 links S 73.40 W 1232 links.) Thence N 77.33 W 1118 links to the top of pali or Kewakua which is the north West corner of this land and SW corner of McRowell and from thence the following places bear
 Ahuelehu Peak Δ N 36.56 W Puualani Peak Δ N 52.27 W Pohakua Peak Δ N 27.48 E. The boundary runs thence S 50.5 W 628 links along top of Kewakua S 22.57 W 368 links. Thence S 57.49 W 1085 links. Thence S 70.33 W 1946 links N 33.25 W 620 links over on to the top of Keahi point. The last four courses are along the top of the pali or Kewakua which is the boundary.
 Returning to the place of commencement the boundary runs along the sea, shore in a NW direction to a point on the

This land is chiefly adapted for grazing purposes it is very stony. There ~~is~~ in the valley a few acres here and there adapted and suitable for raising rice but to no great extent

There is somewhere in this land in this land a block owned by a native, but as the boundary has never been defined it is not possible to say to what extent.
