# Boundary of the Ahupuaa of Hanapepe

Received the following petition  
Honolulu July 8<sup>th</sup> 1873

Honorable Duncan H. Bryde  
Commissioner of Boundaries for the Islands of Hawaii H. I.  
Sir

I am directed by the Commissioner of Crown Lands to make application to you to define and settle the boundaries of the following lands on the Island of Hawaii viz

- The Ahupuaa of Waimea
- " " Hanapepe
- " " Amakela
- " " Hamalei

Thereupon appointed the 23 day of November A.D. 1873 for the hearing of said application and from the evidence of the following witnesses. Opaes Helelela, Hokuuaa, Kampa and Nawa rendered the following decision

## Decision

The Eastern boundary of this land commences on the sea shore at the S.W. corner of Wahuawa at a point called Kewakua at which place is an arch in the Rock or bluff with the sea washing through it, thence to the centre of a pile of stones called Kuke-kawa, thence to centre of pile of stones called Oiniwi, thence to Palakooai, thence to Kaloai near small enclosure and basket bushes, thence to a large stone inside of gateway of Mr. Cowell stone wall called Mopunahoa, thence to Puumakelahi, thence to sharp spur leading down from Pohakoa and called Kaeakihua thence to Pohakoa, thence to high peak Pohakoa, thence to Pohakohi thence to Koa Koa enclosure Kroll in bush, thence along ridge

to the top of Puuauika thence continuing along ridge to high peak Kapoala the north West boundary of Wahiawa thence in a N.W. direction along the ridge until joining open landing from Kahile peak to Waialeale, thence along said ridge until joining open landing up the Western boundary of this land and Eastern boundary of Maunawale, thence down the boundary of Maunawale in a southerly direction to the sea.

Notes of Survey

The eastern boundary of this land commences on the sea shore at the S.W. corner of Wahiawa at a point called Kenuakua at which place is an arch in the rock or cliff with the sea washes through it. at 95 links from top of Pale on the boundary line the following objects bear Ahualike Peak  $N 4.43^{\circ} E$  Puukopale  $N 82^{\circ} 25' W$  Puukani Peak  $N 16^{\circ} 12' W$  Pohakoa Peak on the boundary line  $N 27^{\circ} 52' E$ . Thence from 95 links on this line  $N 27^{\circ} 48' E$  2260 links to the center of a large pile of stones called Kuekualoa thence  $N 16^{\circ} 39' E$  1847 links to center of pile of stones called Oini thence  $N 30^{\circ} 36' E$  1410 links to within 150 links of Cali to place called Palakooai thence  $N 36^{\circ} 53' E$  9035 links to place called Koa to west of some cactus bushes and in a stone enclosure of about  $\frac{1}{4}$  of an acre. Thence  $N 47^{\circ} 23' E$  5753 links (crossing at 5670 links and 60 links to the west of a gateway or stone wall enclosing a land owned by Mr. Rowell) to a large stone & cotta Mopunaha thence the following objects bear Ahualike Peak  $N 40^{\circ} 10' E$  Pohakoa  $N 13^{\circ} 54' E$  thence from Mopunaha  $N 28^{\circ} 16' E$  3900 links to Koiaki. Thence  $N 14^{\circ} 49' E$  2800 links to place called Puukualoa (at 1700 links on this line passes the N.W. corner of house lot now occupied by the Konekone of this land), thence from Puukualoa  $N 5^{\circ} 10' E$  3935 links to sharp spur leading landing down from Pohakoa, and called Kuekualoa. Thence  $N 2^{\circ} 37' E$  2100 links to Pohakoa then a hole was been cut in the rock the boundary runs along the ridge to the eastward of the bearing given (see plan). Thence the following objects bear Ahualike Peak  $S 86^{\circ} 36' W$

a sharp peak on the Makawala Boundary towards Waialeale N 1.57' W  
 Puu Kapaia N 49.48' W. Thence from Pohaku following along the ridge to a  
 peak bearing N 9.10' E 6300 links and called Pohakiki thence following  
 along the ridge to a clear Knoll in the bush to a large tree standing  
 alone N 33.17' E 3700 links. Thence along the ridge to the top of Puu  
 aumaka N 17.45' E 3200 links from thence continuing along the ridge  
 until joining spur leading from Kahiki Peak to Makawala  
 thence in a N.W. direction along the ridge until joining the spur  
 leading up the western boundary of this land and Eastern  
 boundary of Makawala.

The Western boundary <sup>of the land</sup> is described as  
 as starting from Ahu aliku Peak a place well known and easily  
 found. The Boundary from Ahu aliku Peak runs N 12.10' E 2200  
 links along ridge. Thence N 41.49' E 2500 links along the ridge  
 Thence N 5.23' W 1710 links along ridge Thence N 42.23' W 2059  
 links along the ridge. Thence N 13.32' W 1240 links along the  
 ridge. Thence N 66.30' W 750 links along the ridge. Thence N 3.10' E  
 5600 links along the ridge to the edge of the bush, thence  
 continuing along the ridge until joining the spur leading from  
 Kahiki Peak

Returning again to Ahu aliku Peak the boundary  
 runs S 39.27' W 325.00 links to two flat stones at old roadway  
 Thence S 36.31' W 2740 links to the sea shore, thence following  
 along the shore in an easterly direction to place of commencement  
 see plan

Within this land are situated the lands of O'lele  
 Heilewa, Mani'ahi Kouli and a land owned by M. P. ...  
 therefore the area is not given in survey
