# Boundary of the Ahupuaa of Hanalei

I am instructed by the commissioners of Crown lands to make application to you to define and settle the boundaries of the following lands on the Island of Hawaii 1873

- The Ahupuaa of Waima
- " " Hanapepe
- " " Anahola
- " " Hanalei

Thereupon appointed the 23<sup>rd</sup> day of May 1874 for the hearing of said petition and caused notice to be served on the owners of the adjoining lands of the town and place of hearing.

Kalahouani Sworn

My name is Kalahouani Lavin in Hanalei was born in Koolaula, lived at Hanalei since I was very little. Know boundary Kalekaha a Konahele told me when it was it commenced at an opening in the reef  $\frac{1}{2}$  of which belong to Hanalei  $\frac{1}{2}$  to Kalahouani it is called Holohele then a straight to sand beach then along sand beach to a rocky part Kalahouani and thence mauka to

Kalahouani a broad Kala and thence to Waihoahou

Kamoohele a ridge and thence to

Kawa a broad ridge with stones at boundary

Kaulokaha a rocky ledge above government road at thence to

Hapoukaha a small mound and thence to

Hapoukaha Kula and thence to

Kaunaoapi residing place of chiefs Kaunaoapi & Hula hou

Kaunakoaia, a starting place for roads to Waahi thence to  
 Kapuakalani sharp narrow ridge between two gulches thence to  
 Kapualiohaki " " "  
 Kahakawai " small stream " "  
 Mahani flat ridge with Kanawa bushes " "  
 Kapakapa { Stone plow of weihaps (Heaw) " "  
 { end of Kalihikai and junction with Kalihewai  
 Kawaipulea ridge and small stream runs to Kalihewai river  
 I do not know further names but can point out  
 the boundary till it joins with Waialeale from Waialeale it  
 comes down Kona or Waimea till it joins Waiehae and Linnahae  
 thence down Linnahae boundary till Junction with Waiale  
 and down Waiale boundary to the sea.

## Manoaha Sworn

I live in Hanalei was born at Paopoa can  
 bear witness young. Know Boundary of Hanalei Kalauaha  
 pointed it out to me also Kaunakoi, Kalauaha belonged  
 to Kalihikai, Kaunakoi to aniani I was a Kanaka of Kaw-  
 muahii, The boundary commences at Holokoa a ledge out-  
 of break in reef, thence straight through harbor to sand  
 beach thence along sand beach to a rocky point called

Kalaihona thence to  
 Kahakawai a level grassy plain thence to  
 Kakaehala " " " "  
 thence along the different places as given by  
 the two former witnesses to Kawaipulea.

From the above and the evidence of two other additional  
 witnesses the Commission of Boundaries rendered the  
 following decision

## Decision

Commenced at an opening in the Reef one half of which  
 opening belongs to Hanalei and one half to Kalihikai  
 and called Holokoa, and thence straight to sand beach

Thence along sand beach, to a rocky point called Kaloehonu  
 then Maunua on ridge to Kakaheua on road Kula thence cutting  
 on kula to Kakaheua thence through kula land to Kamaohe  
 hua a ridge, and thence to a broad ridge with stones at boundary  
 called Kawa and thence to a rocky ledge above Government  
 Road called Kaulakakua thence to a small mound called  
 Kapekahua, thence through kula land to Kapekahua thence  
 to residing place and kula house of chief Kawaheua thence  
 thence to a place where natives used to start from when rising  
 to the beach and called Kaimuakalea thence up a sharp  
 narrow ridge between two gulches called Kapekahua  
 thence continuing up said ridge to Kapekahua thence  
 to a small stream Kapekahua, thence up a flat ridge Maunua  
 with Naupaka trees, thence to a large and peculiarly shaped  
 stone at an old place of worship (Heiau) called Kapekahua  
 ends Kapekahua and commencement of Kapekahua with Hanalei  
 the boundary then crosses a small stream which runs into  
 Kapekahua river called Kapekahua, and thence to Waialeale  
 between the two last named stations none of the witnesses ex-  
 amined could give any names of stations, from Waialeale  
 the boundary runs down foot of Waialeale till it joins Waialeale  
 and Lanihale and thence down Lanihale boundary till  
 junction with Waialeale and thence down Waialeale to the sea

Notes of Survey of the Ahupuaa of  
Hanalei

The N West corner of this land commences on the sea beach at a  
 place called Maunua where a tall stone is set into the ground  
 with a stone bottle beneath and from whence the following place  
 bears an angle down on the ridge at the head of Waialeale and  
 called Kawa  $\begin{matrix} 561.45 \text{ W} \\ 70.27 \text{ W} \end{matrix}$  most  
 of Waialeale  $\begin{matrix} 530.58 \text{ W} \\ 39.85 \text{ W} \end{matrix}$  then a tall stone on point of spur below

At nearly all stations there have been benches cut  stones put into the ground
