Boundary of Kahili in Molokai

Aug 20

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Received petition from Charles R Bishop agent for his Majesty King Lunalilo, requesting that the boundary of Kahili belonging to his Majesty Lunalilo and situated in the district of Molokai may be defined and settled

Thereupon appointed the 26 May 1874 for the hearing of said petition and caused the owners of the adjoining lands to be notified of the time and place of hearing.

Kamalahua Suva

I have lived in Kahili from long ago, have lived here since the last battle was fought in Hawaii. I know the boundary of this land as pointed out to me by my father Uua and my grandfather Kaleahi never heard of any dispute regarding the boundaries of this land. The boundary commences on the north West corner of this land at the sea shore at rocky bay.

Kapule Stream

My name is Kapule I live in Maakalea I
 formerly lived in Kahili was born there my parents pointed out
 the boundary of Kahili to me, never heard of any dispute re-
 garding it. The boundary of Kahili commences on west side of
 river at a place on shore called Mamohonee
 and from there this witness gives exactly the
 same names of places and descriptions as
 former witness. Kamealama to a place on top
 of high ridge on Mountain called Kalaupala
 thence in a southerly direction along ridge to Puaakea
 " down easterly boundary to Waterfall Waipipololae
 " " to stones Pohakuwoowoa
 " to small stream Pukohikii
 " through trees gulch + stream below bridge Kaluamakee
 " to old Residing place Pahulomui
 " ridge above small stream near for: Poo Puaaee
 " westerly side of large Kalopatch Kulihaiti
 " to mound where formerly school house + Kaula
 " down to ridge above rocks where
 offerings were formerly made to the } Oaakeahi
 Ahua. this place is in Peiwa the same
 as former witness stated.

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Decision

Commences on the sea shore at a place called Manohonuu ledge of rocks, and thence to top of ridge called Puumauahiki, thence down side or foot of hill to a place in the river near the edge and called Koauala, thence up along side of right bank of river to Oihoe, thence up same side of river to a large Kala patch called Kaluawai, thence follow up same side of river to a kaha tree called Poaku, thence up river to Kala patch called Kamalohale, thence up same side to Kala patch and kaha tree Kubaialani, thence up same side to stones near Aina Kala called Hoolohinuu, continuing up same side to Aina Kala called Makuakookoo, thence up below (stone) ledge to foot rapids of river Pohakitea thence across river to stones close to bank called Kameawakee, thence runs up hill through stony and rocky ground to Pu-kaha grove called Pohakupu, thence up to edge of stony brow Kubaianuu, thence up ridge through puhalo trees to a short distance above small bridge on Government Road Puumamam, thence up ridge and across gulch to Kapuwaale thence through a small stream called by the same, to a broad level land called Waialaare, thence up through forest to a stone called Kamaluaionohi thence up ridge to Kalaupala, the boundary then turns in a southerly direction to Puauhea, thence down Easterly Boundary to Waterfall Waihipololei thence to stone Pohakewoawoa, thence to large Kubaianuu Pohakolele, thence to small stream Puhohiki, thence to huu tree gulch and stream below ridge Kalamakua thence to old residing place Pahulomee, thence to ridge above small stream near Government road to Puumamam thence through western side of large Kala patch Kalihale, thence to near a mound where there was formerly a school house and called Kaula thence down ridge to Kaeewa and thence to a place where

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offerings used to be made called Paakechi (this place is in Kairua) thence to Kairua rocks in sea shore and thence out and round reef to place of commencement
