# Boundary of the Ahupuaa of Olohina

Honolulu September 15<sup>th</sup> 1873  
Hon<sup>ble</sup> Messrs McBrayde  
Commissioners of Boundaries  
Sir

In settling the boundaries of lands on your Island please have defined the following which have been suggested to me by Judge Medemann viz Waialeale 1/2 of Honohou, Hanakapiouu Kalalau Puhakoua Houipoua Kamalomalo Kakaamui Kalaulea?

Mountaining lands adjoining Mokuu whakou man  
etc etc

W. B. Olohina 1/2 belonging to Government (undivided)

Owing to the Boundary of the adjoining land of Olohina belonging to his late Majesty Leialoha having been decided on the 7<sup>th</sup> November 1872 and the boundary of the Crown Lands of Kapoa and Waialeale having been decided on 13 and 14 November 1872 said three lands being surrounded by the land of Olohina no further evidence was taken the commission not considering it necessary, the Government having been represented by Sheriff Isaac, Pea for himself + children and the crown by Makalemi

From the evidence of the several witnesses examined on the previous days the following decision was rendered and as in all cases survey ordered

## Decision

The south East boundary of this land commences on the sea beach at a place called Kikaha, and from thence marches to Kulahukuu thence to Puhakoua thence to Kakaamui thence to rocks on top of cliff looking like a dog house, thence

up over and down foot of hill to single water tree. from there to pond  
 in March called Kamala, thence to Pookahua, thence crossing  
 numerous gullies and spurs to top of Kamoochoospale ridge, thence up each  
 ridge to Kihulaw, thence up through forest to Kapohuaha the  
 head of this land and junction with Kapaa

The NW boundary of this land commences at a hollow  
 the reef called Pohakuao, thence to hill of stones called Koa-  
 punakoa thence along old stone wall to swamps and across  
 swamp to Waialeale an old Kala tank thence to Alalena thence  
 to Kalaisukiuiki, thence to Makana, thence to Kopaa thence  
 to Paapua, thence to Kulelepa, thence to Puu-paa, thence up  
 to edge of woods and up ridge to head of Waipoua at a large  
 tree, thence up ridge to Kapohuaha the head of this  
 land and junction with NE boundary

# Notes of Survey of the Government Land of Oloheua

This south East corner of this land commences at the sea beach  
 at a place called Kikeke and runs thence N. 31. 39 W true 322 1/2  
 links to a place called Kulahuhu then turns due S. let into  
 the ground from 181 links on this line at a long stone bottle,  
 the following places bear Pohakupili N 42. 13 W Awakala  
 Peak N 2. 36 E New Peak N 65. 15 W Ahooka Peak N  
 575. 30 W Variation of the needle at this station is 8. 13 E  
 was 8. 21 thence from Kulahuhu N 48. 29 W 2600 L.  
 was 9. 0 Puuhau po thence 63. 57 W 4057 L to the  
 Kauhulohia bay thence N 62. 33 W 1050 up foot of pale to
