Boundary of the Ahupua'a of Kikiaola

I hereby beg to request that you will when convenient, have the boundaries of the following lands settled and defined.

The Ahupua'a of Koolow bounded E by Mahana-lepes and Hailaw belonging to the Estate of Kamohiamani & North by Kamohiamani and Koolow W by Lanai and S by the sea.

The Ahupua'a of Kikiaola bounded E by the Ahupua'a of Waimua N by Waimua and Poku W by Kikiaola and S by the sea.

Therefore appointed the 15 day of April A.D. 1874 for the hearing of said petition at Waimua court house at the hour of ten am.

Honorable Dwyer

I was born at Kikiaola my Kikiaola is there, and with the chiefs as a body man or also my Brother, all dead that know boundary. The boundary commences at a stone in the river called Pohakalani thence down away of Kikiaola to Wauli thence along pali below house of Eloselwai and East side of Nawalaens house. Thence down to stone near rice house and out to reef and thence west along to a little sand hill called Kikiai and thence north to the pali Hulea-huluni and thence along foot of pali to a large stone called Pohakalani the place of commencement.

1874 Boundary of the Ahupua'a of Kihiaola

Maemake Swam

Commencing at Waiuli and thence along water bed of Kihiaola to promontory in bay of Kihiaola thence along pali by Keapoua house, thence also along the pali in valley called Kahuamaa, thence along the Kula land commences at a rocky point called Kaamamaama and thence along pali to Papeaema and thence to rolling surf on reef and thence to a place in sea Kuhuiki and thence along the opposite side of Kihia in the pali of Hulehule and thence including face of pali to place of commencement

C. C.

I know this from my father he had fish, it belonged to him, he had the fishing right along the Kula, Kahualealii Swam

Commences at Pohakalani thence down to Waiuli and thence between Waiuli and Kaamama to the Auwai of Kihiaola and thence along the Auwai to the pali and thence round to Pohakalani the place of commencement, The Boundary runs along the pali to Papeaema and out to surf at Kuhuiki thence west to promontory Kihia and thence N to Pohakalani thence along top of pali to Kaamama place of commencement.

I live at Papeaema from time of Kaamama Papeaema then belonged to Waiuli never belonged to Kihiaola, I remember when Kihiaola was given by Kaamama to a foreigner Hulemama, The fish of Luhu was also given to Hulemama, as a separate gift this Kula

Land was not given Luhu in the sea. Waimua was the name of all this Kula never heard of this land. Being called Kikaula till this day

I was born at Maunaloa left there when young
Lai Sworn

After the war I lived at Kapapaemaena it then belonged and does now to Waimua what I heard was that the fish belonged to Kikaula. Keeseeva built wall by Keamauna Don't know why he built fence as place to cultivate perhaps, cultivated under Waimua Keeseeva. Know boundary of Kikaula it does not include all to the pali

L. E.

A strip of Land near the pali belongs to Waimua Puka Land and Whitney's house is in Waimua I was born at Maunaloa

Nai-alaa Sworn

Lived at Papaemaena house but never lived there from the time I was young the place belonged to Waimua never heard of its belonging to Kikaula. Don't know of Kikaula ever having been given to any foreigner, had a piece of land in the Kula below the church. Kamao leased it to me, Kamao is governor Leased it for 25 \$ per annum in 1856 in 1856 paid rent to Mr Webster, Samuel was then Keeseeva

L. E.

Did not tell you before that my new house was in Kikaula said that I heard it was.

Peepu Sworn

Lived Waimua was born there formerly lived in Papaemaena. Kamao Kamao knew of his giving land of Kikaula to Hulumani also the fish of Luhu Land above Luhu belonged to Waimua Hulumani belongs

to Kikiala my brother in law owned Kikiala. Kono Kikiala
built a wall by spinnors, this was in Waimea. Kono Kikiala of
Kikiala did not work there, afterwards cultivated by Kono Kikiala

Isaac H. Kapauniai Sworn

I am adopted son of Kapauniai who was
Kono Kikiala of Waimea, he was Kono Kikiala of the Kula and lived
sometimes in Kawai house in 1850 repaired fence and planted
potatoes for Kalijima. Kono that Kikiala had any Kula
land only Kalo land and fishing right between the Kalo
land and the pali there is a piece of land belonging to
Waimea Kapauniai planted potatoes there.

When I came to Waimea found mission
cattle running on the land towards Kikiala, Mrs Whitney
told me the ownership was in the Mission. Don't know when
I first heard it was Kikiala perhaps Mrs Whitney told me
this was in 1846. This continued till land commission estab-
lished, got copy list of Mission lands from Mrs Whitney
and handed it to the land commission, this Kula land
was not included house lands were. This land then spoken
of by natives as Kikiala about 1846 to 1849 about 1848
division of lands took place and Kikiala was given to
government, remained a short time in government hands and
McLeasie informed me that Kikiala had given some
other land to the government for this but that my land
was reserved, it was for Princess Victoria. I bought 640
acres in Kikiala

Kamahehiki Sworn

I was a Luma of Kikiala, Kamahehiki was Konehiki forget the year, but before it was sold by Government to Powell, he (Konehiki) left soon as he had notice that the land did not belong to Government but to Maluanihi. I was then Luma Kamahehiki's Kaka, must go to Kapunihi to get the boundary, Kapunihi said it commenced at a big stone in river, thence comes down an aua along bottom of pali to Kolohele from Kolohele runs down face of pali to and along side of Kailiilika's house then by a lili, by large canoe house thence along a Kuleana of Isaac to Kuekuele in the sea thence west along coral reef to opposite Kikiala thence Maunaloa through Kikiala to a stone called Pohokuaia at bottom of Pali and then along face or side of pali to place of commencement

My testimony is given as Kapunihi gave it to me
Maluanihi Sworn

I am acquainted with Kikiala since I was a long time boundary, gives identically the same boundary as former witness with the exception that he puts the Boundary further out in the sea. Whymy says Konehiki of this land when I first knew it, Konehiki gave the land to Whymy by these boundaries as I have described
W.E.

I have lived at Waiau, I did not stay at Kikiala I worked under Whymy I worked because I lived at Waiau, Whymy Kakaed the Kai all the natives on these three lands worked under Whymy (Waiau, Kikiala and Kakaia) on Konehiki days

I. Kakaia Sworn

In 1860 I and my wife went to Honolulu to buy goods for the house stayed at Kakaia's house

1875 Boundary of the Ahupua'a of Kikiwala.

Kekuamānoa said to Victoria give Kikiwala to my wife as Kōwhiri of the land Victoria said yes then Kekuamānoa said the land is in your charge. I said yes. I then asked him the boundary of Kikiwala. he said it was not surveyed but would give it as known to him, commencing at Kaimāmānoa there are three Kalo patches, thence to ridge of Pale and thence down Pale to the lagoon of Pōpōwāwā thence out to sea at a place called Keakeli, thence along reef to a place opposite to Kikiwala, thence poleward to the pale, thence along pale to Kaimāmānoa, thence to Pohāpōhāpōhā thence along water course to Kalaui & Kikiwala thence to junction with Waialeale and right along Waialeale to the pale, Kekuamānoa asked me if I knew this boundary. I said no, he then said go and ask the Kāmōamānoa, I did so and was told as above. I bought this house lot from Kekuamānoa it is described as in Kikiwala, deed produced and examined, and found to be signed by Kōwhiri and Kekuamānoa and registered by Thomas Brown.

Kaimāmānoa Sworn

Evidence unimportant.

Opunui Sworn

Kāmōamānoa gave this land to Whittney Pōpōwāwā a waialeale was then Kōwhiri whom Whittney got land now belonged to Kikiwala. Kōwhiri afterwards was Kōwhiri, I was lūmua then the sea was Kōpōwā I took fish and then sold them, no water lived in it den time in Kikiwala the Mo'i was the Kōpōwā fish. The land commences at Pohāpōhāpōhā thence to Pale and down pale to the sea.

Deed of Kiamamaleu in 1865 to W. Knudsen of Kikialoa by his trustee Charles Coffin Harris dated 29 June 1865.

Kiamamaleu's Son

Was born at Kikialoa lived there afterwards at different times, heard from my father and other old men that there were two ahuwai, the inner one is the bounded area from there to the pole belongs to Waimua the Pole to pole, the ahuwai is there still. This ahuwai comes down to a place called Paulu, disputed land about 200 fathoms in width, never heard of any Kula land belonging to Kikialoa except the patch of Paulu, sea given by Kiamamaleu to a person because there was no fishing right attached to this land.

Wm Whitney never knew this land to belong to him, nor he heard that sea belonged to Whitney, don't know names of this Kula, after death of Whitney don't know to whom sea belonged perhaps to Whitney's wife or her heirs, don't know if sea was Kapeua, Mahanani were formerly Koniwhaka the sea was then Kapeua

Kaumileli's Son

I lived in Kikialoa from the time of Kanihokou. The boundary is at an old watercourse made to take water into Paulu Kikialoa commences at Pohakukalani from Paulu to ahuwai belongs to Waimua, don't know of any Kula land belonging to Kikialoa, this Kula land is disputed belong to Waimua top of pole belong to Hulumanu and to the sea, Kiamamaleu gave the sea to Whitney, or also the Kula land, sea was given to the Kula lands of Kikialoa

Presented several documents, in this disputed land and described as in Waimua

Decision in favor of Petitioner

1873 Boundary of the Ahupua'a of Kikiakoa

Decision

The commission finds for the petitioners in regard to the disputed land between the old amai and the Pale, said land belongs to Kikiakoa. The commission also finds that the Kula land surrounding McRowell's land and the church land belong to Kikiakoa with the fishing right pertaining to the same.

The Boundary of this land commences at a place called Puhakalani and from there to the Pale (including three Kaulapatches) thence the Boundary follows the top of the pali down to the bay of Keapapa near Mr. Kaudson's new house, thence out to sea at edge of reef at a place called Kuakeli, thence along the reef to a place opposite to Kikiakoa, thence inland to a stream at foot of pali and thence along the face of Pale to place of commencement.
