Thereupon appointed the 10th June 1875 for the hearing of said petition and caused notice to be served on the owners of the adjoining lands.

Court opened at 10 am

We were sworn

Boundary of Waimoa commences at the sea beach at the mouth of the Waimoa river at a place called Laka-hala thence along river banks to fork of river at a place called Laka. Thence round edge of river to Pualima thence to and along a causeway Manuakela thence to cactus bush on top of hill called Kaurenihi. Thence round ridge to Kahaloakoa thence to Kahaloakohala a rise on the ridge thence to Kauhama a rise on ridge thence to Kapaeha a creek bed on ridge thence to a flat on ridge called Kauhama thence to Puhakua thence to Kauhama a ridge thence to a hill called Kaurenihi termination of Wokahama with Manuakela thence to

The boundary of Waimea commences at the sea
adjoining Neulolo, at a place called Puanaiaa and thence
up ridge to Kawaipapa and thence to Poupou and thence
to Pihakewaoa, thence up and along ridge to Puu-pu
thence up to Alakoi

The foregoing evidence being so unsatisfactory the commis-
sion was unable to form any opinion in reference to the
boundary of Waimea adjoining Wawapuu, Kalalau, Nanea,
Kapehi and Wainiha, requested Mr. Milroy to proceed to
the Pali lands and compare the evidence taken in reference to
said pale lands, with the evidence taken by the Commission
at Waimea and the evidence of several old natives resident
at Milolii. After Mr. Milroy examined the boundaries of
the several lands bordering on Waimea for over five days
and consulted with the aforesaid natives at Milolii the
Commission of Boundary was enabled to render the following
decision.

Decision

The south East corner of this land commences at the mouth
of the Waimea river on its eastern bank, and thence runs
S.W. along the sea shore to Saehobide. Thence continuing along
beach to Kawaia, thence to Pihakohai, thence along shore to
Maolawa, thence along shore to Noheli in Moana (Sounding sand),
thence continuing along beach to Kapehi, thence along shore
to Polihale, here ends the sand beach and commences the
rocky coast and pali, thence along rocky coast to point at
Milolii, thence past Alapii point by Neulolo to point N.E. of
Neulolo bay and called Puanaiaa the N.W. corner of this land
and S.W. corner of Wawapuu, a Government land, from this point
the boundary runs up face of Pali to peak, and continuing
and continuing along the ridge to Pihakewaoa a large

peculiarly shaped stone on the East brow of Kaunimuhua ridge. From this stone, the Boundary follows the water shed of the Kaunimuhua ridge, through forest land and along the top of pali overlooking Kalalau to the top of a high noted peak called Pūpūpū. the S.E. corner of Kalalau and S.W. and S.W. corner of Pohakuae. Thence the boundary continues along water shed of mountain range, bounded on the East by the land of Waihi to where it joins the land of Makawili at a place called Kapahe the W.E. corner of this land and S.W. corner of Waihi.

The eastern Boundary of this land runs from place of commencement along the land of Makawili up the East bank of the Wainia river to opposite the junction of the Wainia & Makawili rivers, thence up along E bank of river to stone -- thence to causeway and up to cliff above Makawili valley, thence up ridge to cactus bushes. Thence up ridge to top of Nahaleaha. Thence to Kalehuahuaiki the south West corner of Makawili, thence following in an Easterly direction the watershed of the ridge to Kapahe the East corner of this land and junction with the N.E. boundary.

The south East corner of these lands commences at the mouth of the Waimea river on its eastern bank, The survey commences at a trig station on the south west corner of old Russian Fort on the land of Makawale from this trig station Pualani Δ on Makawale bears S 88° 37' E true, near of the needle 7.10' Kalehuakahi peaks a high range on the boundary of these lands and Makawale bears N 26° 50' E true, N 19° 20' Mag. Thence the S and W boundary of these lands runs along the sea coast as far as Puawaea point where it joins the Government land of Waiaupohia, notes as follows from Trig station Δ true bearing
