JUDGMENT.

An application to decide and certify the boundaries of the Land  
of Kealia District of Puna Island of  
Kauai having been filed with me on the 7 day of April  
1870 by E. Drull Esq.

in accordance with the provisions of an Act to facilitate the settlement of Boundaries, &c., approved on the 22d day of June, A. D. 1868; now, therefore, having duly received and heard all the testimony offered in reference to the said boundaries and having gone on the said land, at the request of

E. Drull and John O. Donnells  
and having endeavored otherwise to obtain all information possible to enable me to arrive at a just decision, which will more fully appear by reference to the records of this matter by me kept in Book No. 1, page 11, and it appearing to my satisfaction that the true, lawful and equitable boundaries, are as follows, viz:

Commencing upon the sea shore at the South East corner of this land at rocks at low water mark called Wailua which point is in a straight line with the Northwesterly side of Hapoa river, before it turns piontwise to entering the sea, from the above point following the sea to a small stream of water on Kumukumu and thence pass up and around the boundaries of the land called Kumukumu to the sea, at the North East corner of Kumukumu & from thence.

Note: Kumukumu has since his division been purchased by E. Drull  
from the government.

following the sea to a stone on the south bank at the entrance into the sea of the small stream or river called Ramalamalo, which is the NE corner of land called Hoomaikawaa. From this above point the Northerly Boundary of these lands runs along South side of Ramalamalo River, to top edge of a certain hill. Thence along near edge of Pali bounding Ramalamalo gulch on the south, and along on top of ridge separating Hoomaikawaa and Ramalamalo gulch. Thence passing along near North side of Realia Auwai and from thence following always along near North side of Realia Auwai, to a point in the Auwai a short distance Makeli of the crossing of the old mountain road on the edge of the bank of a small stream of water. From thence crossing said stream, and following along near said old Mountain road to the entrance of said road into the forest. Thence following always along said mountain road up along on the tops of the ridge bounding Realia river on the North, to a clearing on the ridge called Pohakehapaia. From thence passing along near top of ridge bounding Realia Valley on its Northerly side to the extreme North west corner of the Land.

The boundary on the South side commencing upon the sea shore at the South East corner of these lands at the place called

Waitia, crossing said spit to Kapaa River, and up along Northly side of said river in all its turnings and windings, to where it crosses the stream called Makole, thence passing up through the middle of the river to a Kukui Tree on Northly side of the river, near mouth of the crossing of the Government road, thence to the middle of the Kapaa River, from thence up through the middle of Keloa River to the top of Ridge at Junction of Kapaa & Kealia Rivers and thence following up in middle of said Ridge to an open clearing, thence to tops of Ridge bounding Minomino valley on the south from thence following along marshes on tops of said ridge to bluff where said ridge runs northwardly called Pualawi, thence following along tops of said ridge bounding Minomino on the South and Kealia valley, passing over mountain peak called Hape to a sharp, tall, rocky peak, called Pohakupili from thence following along on spali bounding Kealia valley on the south to a ridge on marshy side of a deep gulch running down into Kealia valley from thence following down said ridge and crossing Kealia river and valley to the North West corner of these lands.

It is therefore <sup>adjudged</sup> and I do hereby decide and certify that the boundaries of the said land are and hereinafter shall be as heretofore set forth

The undersigned your petitioner report  
fully represents unto your Honor that he is the owner  
and in possession of the Chapman's of lands called Ke-  
alia Walaaua & Homahawa situated in the district of  
Puna Island of Hawaii, that the same was not awarded  
to him by the Land Commission, patented or conveyed by  
deed from his majesty the King by boundaries described  
in such award patent or deed and therefore your petitioner  
makes this application to your Honor to have the bound-  
aries of said land, decided and certified to, in accor-  
dance with the provisions of the act entitled, An Act to fa-  
cilitate the settlement of boundaries &c &c approved June 23<sup>rd</sup>  
1868, and in furtherance of this application represents  
that the said lands of Kealia situated as aforesaid adjoin  
the land called Kapea owned by the Commissioners of  
Crown Lands and also adjoins the Government lands  
called Hamakua and is under the supervision and  
control of the Excellency W. Hutchinson, H. M. Minister of  
the Indian and said land is now fully described in  
the annexed copy survey.

Whereupon appointed the 5<sup>th</sup> day of November 1870  
for the hearing of said Application, and according to  
law Notified the commissioners of Crown and Government  
lands.

Court opened at Kealia 9 AM

The parties appeared and declared themselves ready for  
trial.

After the hearing of the several Witnesses the court gave

Boundaries of Heala according to decision  
rendered on the 5<sup>th</sup> day of December 1870:

Commencing upon the sea that the SE corner of this land, at rocks at low water mark, called Waileia which point is in a straight line with the Northwly side of Kapaia River before it turns previous to entering the sea, and bearing North 88° West, to high rocky point called Pehakapile. From the above point following the sea to the small stream of water on Hemanalea and thence passing up and around the boundaries of the land called Hemanalea by the following bearings & distances N. 78° W. 35' chains. N. 72° west 203 chains. N. 70° 30' W. 13 chains. N. 82° 30' W. 10 chains N. 65° W. 17 chains N. 50° W. 9 chains N. 44° W. 8 chains N. 74° W. 28  $\frac{1}{2}$  chains S. 86° East 31 chains S. 82° E. 30 chains S. 70° E. 42  $\frac{1}{2}$  chains S. 67° E. 17 chains S. 76° E. 6 chains S. 67° 30' E. 14 chains & S. 84° W. to the sea. The Boundary on the South side, commencing upon the sea, at the South East corner of these lands at the place called Waileia, runs S. 75° W 1061 feet crossing sand spit to Kapaia river and up along southwesterly sides of said river in all its turns and windings by the following bearings & distances S 75° 30' West 500 feet N 23° 30' W 279 feet N 3° W 680 feet N 42° 30' E 269 feet N 18° E 260 feet N 36° 30' W 243 feet N 72° W 369 feet S 77° 30' W 400 feet S 54° W 765 feet N 67° 30' W 1372 feet N 65° 30' 354 feet N 44° W 1300 feet N 81° W 1449 feet N 42° W 660 S 74° W 350 feet, crossing the aurai called Mekoli, thence S 36° W. 150 feet N 68° W 200 feet, N 64° W 131 feet N 65° W 470 feet, thence passing up through the middle of the river S 70° W 1100 feet to a Kukui tree on Northwesterly side of the river, near mouth of the croning of the Hamakua Road, thence S 57° W 238 feet over Kula and S 34° W 978 feet to the middle of Kapaia river, from thence up through the Middle of Kapaia River N 67° W 480 feet + N 73° W 220 feet N 44° W. 600 feet N 10° 30' W 589 feet N 30° 30' W 320 feet, N 32° W 324 feet, N 28° W 263 feet N 95° W 290 feet S 56° W 225 feet S 57° 30' W 375 feet S 68° 30' W 495 feet to an open clearing, thence N 77° 30' W to top of Ridge bounding Minomini Valley on the south, from thence following along mouth on top of said ridge to cliff, when said ridge runs southerly called Peleauhi, thence following along top of said ridge bounding Minomini on the South and Healia Valley, passing over Mountain peak called Hapea to the sharp, tall, rocky peak called Pohakuhapai, from thence following along on Pali bounding Healia Valley on the South about 500 feet, to a ridge on Makai side of a deep gulch running down into Healia Valley, from thence following down said ridge and crossing Healia river and valley to the North west corner of these lands.

## Rerulua Boundary

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The following decision was rendered on the 5<sup>th</sup> day of December  
A.D. 1870 but neglected to be entered

Commencing upon the sea shore at the south East corner of this land at rocks at low water mark, called Waileia which point is in a straight line with the Northwesterly side of Tapaoa river before it turns previous to entering the sea, from the above point following the sea to a small stream of water on Kumuakumu and thence passing up and around the Boundary of the land called Kumuakumu to the sea at the North East corner of Kumuakumu and from thence following the sea to a stone on the south bank at the entrance into the sea of the small stream or river called Kamaalamalo, which is the N.E. corner of land called Hoowakawaa. From the above point the Northwesterly Boundary of these lands runs along south sides of Kamaalamalo river to top edge of a certain hill, thence along near edge of pale bounding Kamaalamalo gulch on the South and along on tops of ridge separating Hoowakawaa & Kamaalamalo gulch, thence passing along near north side of Heatal Auwai and from thence following always along near North side of Heatal Auwai to a point in the Auwai a short distance makai of the crossing of the old mountain road on the edge of the banks of a small stream of water. From thence crossing said stream, and following along near said old mountain road to the entrance of said old mountain road into the forest thence following always along said mountain road up along on the tops of the ridge bounding Heatal river on the North to a clearing on the ridge called Pohakuhapai. From thence passing along near tops of ridge bounding Heatal valley on its Northwesterly side to the extreme north west corner of these lands.

The Boundary on the south side, commencing on the sea shore at the South East corner of these lands at the place called Waileia crossing sandspit to Tapaoa river and up along Northwesterly side of said river in all its turns and windings to where it enters the Auwai called Mahole.

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Decision Realia Boundary continued

1870

Dec 13

Thence passing up through the middle of the river to a Rancheria on North side of the river near Makarai of the end of the government road. Thence to the Middle of the Rapoa river from thence up through the middle of the Rapoa river to the rapids or ridge at Junction of Rapoa and Realia river and thence following up on middle of said Ridge to an open clearing. This is 1st top of Ridge bounding Menomeni valley on the South, from thence following along mountain on top of Ridge to Bluff where said Ridge runs easterly called Puna akewi. Thence following along top of said Ridge bounding Menomeni on the south and Realia Valley passing over mountain peak called Napoi to a tall sharp rocky peak called Pohakapuli from thence following along on pointe bounding Realia Valley on the south to a ridge on makarai side of a deep gully running down into Realia Valley from thence following down said Ridge and crossing Realia River and Valley to the North West corner of these lands.
