JUDGMENT.

An application to decide and certify the Boundaries of the Land
of Pilaa District of Moloaa Island of
Kauai having been filed with me on the 28 day of August
1873 by Charles R Bishop and Charles
Kanana, guardians of W. L. Kualilei
in accordance with the provisions of an Act to facilitate the settlement of Bound-
aries, &c., approved on the 22d day of June, A. D. 1868; now, therefore,
having duly received and heard all the testimony offered in reference to
the said boundaries and having gone on the said land, at the request of
W. H. Rice, Council for the guardians of Kualilei
and having endeavored otherwise to obtain all information possible to enable
me to arrive at a just decision, which will more fully appear by reference to the
records of this matter by me kept in Book No. 1, page 17, and it
appearing to my satisfaction that the true, lawful and equitable boundaries,
are as follows, viz:

Commencing on the North East boundary at
a rocky point on the sea shore near Blow
Hole, and thence wauka to a place called
Kawau, thence to Kamakole thence to
Hala Tree at Kahuia, thence across the
Government Road and on up past Rubai
Trees, thence to Luah Kauanua. Thence
to stones called Napua Pilau, thence to
dry gulch Namahawa, thence to junction
of three lands Waipake Lapaule

and Pila, at a place called Kalewae
thence in a straight line to Puaiahae
thence to Kawopai, thence to stream Ka-
lealaea, thence to an Ahalia tree on
ridge Kamomokew. thence along ridge to
stream, and down stream to Waiala falls
thence to old House lot. Moku, thence to
Waikuna, thence to rocks Pohakumale-
mala, thence to Palai Hill. thence to
Alanakai, thence to old Kalo-patch Palao
thence to Kualau, thence to a stone on
sea shore called Pohakumalemala, thence
out to edge of Reef and round to place of
commencement.

It is therefore adjudged, and
I do hereby decide and certify that the
Boundaries of the said land are and hereafter
shall be as hereinbefore set forth

The N.E. boundary commences on the beach at a stone on the W side of a small cave on the table rock the sea having access to it through an arch and runs thence S 18°^W ¹⁰⁰⁰ links to the top of terrace called "Kauaw" from thence the following objects




to sea to form boundary of fishing right
and thence in an easterly direction to place
of commencement and containing an area
of One Thousand Five hundred and Twenty
acres (1520 acres)

and a bottle  thus
