JUDGMENT.


An application to decide and certify the Boundaries of the Land
of Wahiaawa District of Poloa Island of

Hawaii having been filed with me on the 14 day of July
1873 by Irau O. Dernans Administrator of the
Estate of his late Majesty Kamehameha V
in accordance with the provisions of an Act to facilitate the settlement of Boundaries, &c., approved on the 22d day of June, A. D. 1868; now, therefore,

having duly received and heard all the testimony offered in reference to
the said boundaries and having gone on the said land, at the request of
I. W. Lyay acting for Irau O. Dernans
and having endeavored after my best information possible to enable
me to arrive at a just decision, which will more fully appear by reference to the
records of this matter kept in Book No. 1, page 47, and it
appearing to my satisfaction that the true, lawful and equitable boundaries,
are as follows, viz:

The Western Boundary of this
land commences at a point on the sea shore or
the South West point of the Wahiaawa
Harbour at a place known as Kemahua a
which place an arch in the cliff has the sea
running through it. Thence to the centre of
a large pile of stones called Pukihala
Thence to the centre of a pile of stones Onio
Thence to Paliwai, thence to Kalani west
of some cactus bushes, and in an enclosure of
stone fencing of about One Quarter of an acre

Thence to a stone inside of Rowells stone fence near gateway and called Mosunahoa Thence to Koiahi. Thence to Pewekuhuhu near the com of a house lot once occupied by the Ronihiki of this land Thence to open Reukuhua. Thence to tops of high peaks Pohataea, Thence along ridge to Pohataiki, Thence along ridge to clear Knoll in Bush at a Row Tree standing alone Thence along ridge to Pewauka. Then along ridge to the highest point of Rapakow thence round ridge to Rahili and junction of this land with Rakahao

The Eastern Boundary of this land at sea beach at a point called Rokes at a large stone the shape of an hour glass and runs thence to a place called Ouwani Thence to a place called Teahuat, Thence to Puulolehole a square of stones with three holes in the centre Thence to Rahuakawaka, Thence to a place called Rukhawakow, Thence to Makaka-wale, Thence to Rahalehii Thence cross several small gullies, and through Dow of Boring Dow Establishment and part West side of Bridge on government road to a place called Raukahaka where there is a large tree Thence across gully and up past stockyards to a stone with a split in it called Waipapo-auna Thence to a large rock ten feet high with a split in it thus  and called Rapoura Thence on up through bush to a large tree on top of ridge and called Rapitivahini

Thence along ridge adjoining Palahia to high
peak Rahili and junction with Western
Boundary.

It is therefore adjudged and I do
hereby decide and certify that the boundaries
of said land are and hereafter shall be as
hereunder set forth.

Notes of Survey of Wahiau R.P.
by C. L.
James W. Gay

The Western Boundary of this Land commences at a point where the Sea Shores on the South West point of Wahiau Harbor at a place known as Benakua at which place an arch in the cliff has the sea running through it. The following objects bear from 95 links from top of Pali, on this boundary Ahualikau Peak 44° 43' E. Punkapule 432° 25' W. Opunari Peak 415° 12' W. The boundary runs thence 427° 48' E. 27600 links to the centre of a large pile of Stones called Kukukalua. Thence to centre of pile of Stones called Oiwai to within 150 links of Pali and called Palikoaai. Thence to place called Pralaai to the west of some cactus bushes, and in an enclosure of Stone fencing of about $\frac{1}{4}$ of an acre crossing at 5640 links Mr. Romell's Stone wall and 10 links to the West of Gateway to large Stone and called Hopuniatua. Thence the following objects bear Ahualikau Peak 40° 15' W. under 39° 13'. Pohakua Peak ahead on this boundary 13° 54' 12' 54'. Thence from Hopuniatua 27° 16' 3900 links to Roiahi. Thence 14° 49' E. 2800 links to place called Punokalua at 1700 links on this line passes the west corner of house lot once occupied by the Monohiki of this Land.

Thence from Purokahuhi

- 4 15° 10' & 39 35 Links to sharp Spur leading down from Pohakeas and called Keukiolua. From whence commencement of Survey at beach bears 5° 29' 39" W. Ahualiko Peak of 83° 23' W. Thence from Keukiolua
- 4 2° 34' & 21 00 Links to Pohakeas there a hole has been cut in the rocks. The Boundary runs along the ridge to the Eastward of. Bearing given (see plan). Ahualiko Peak bears 5° 86' 56" W., a sharp peak on Makaweli and Hanapepe boundary towards Waialeale
- 4 1° 54' & Punkapale of 49° 48' W. Nudos 46.48. Thence from Pohakeas following along the ridge to a peak bearing or 9° 10' & 13 00 Links and called Potrakiti. Thence following along ridge to a clear Knoll in the bush to a Buo tree standing alone
- 4 33° 14' & 37 00 Links. Thence along the ridge to the top of Punam
- 4 1° 45' & 32 00 . , and thence continuing along the ridge until joining Spur leading from Kahili Peak to Waialeale
- The Eastern Boundary of this Land commences at sea beach at a point called Stokes at a large stone the shape of an hour glass (see plan) 400 Links from beach and runs thence N 0. 12' E Nudos 1:00 1193 Links to a place called Oratrani. Thence
- 4 10° 5' & 17 99 Links to place called Keahua. Thence
- 4 1° 50' & 44 00 . to Puuholehole a square of stones with three fit into centre (thru □)
- 4 2° 42' & 25 64 . to place called Baluakanaka from thence bear Ahualiko Peak or 39° 29' W. Pohakeas Peak of 8° 42' W. (Thence from Baluakanaka)
- 4 18° 10' & 29 33 Links to places called Pukanaikoa.

V 28.58^t 16th 3 links from place called Oakarawale
V 18.15 & 28.30 to , , Bahalikir
V 14.26 & 46.90 along crossing several small gullies and
through dam of Boilingdown Establishment and place past
the west side of Bridge on Government Road to place called
Kraairaka a large stone from whence bear Poharee
V. 39.56^t Judge K.C. Bryde's Survey Staff V 13.56 a tree
in bush at head of this Survey called Kapilivahine
V 5.20^t From Kraairaka
V 10.57^t 32.81 links passing a gully and passing 10 links
to the Westward of the S.W. corner of old Stock Yard to a stone
with a split in it called Waipaavaia. Thence
V 4.40^t 33 1/4 links passing a gully several times to a large
rock about 10 feet high with a split in the top (thus )
and called Kapuna. Thence
V 1.30^t 7100 links on up through bush to a large tree on
top of ridge and called Kapilivahine. The land above
this is not accessible and without going to great expense
in cutting lines through bush, cannot be surveyed further.
The quantities therefore are computed thence from an
assumed line drawn on plan from Kapilivahine across
to Punaree, and contains an area of 41 7/8 acres.
There is a considerable portion of this land owned by
Mr. Powell, but owing to bad Survey cannot be correctly
ascertained.
Surveyed on Magnetic reading var. 8° 41' East
I hereby certify that the above notes are a
correct Survey of the boundary as pointed out to me and
settled by Judge K.C. Bryde, Commissioner of Boundaries
for Hawaii.
At all my stations on Survey either a trench is cut

(thru Y) or three stones set into the ground (thru . . .)
