JUDGMENT.

An application to decide and certify the Boundaries of the Land
of Wahiawa District of Koloa Island of
Hawaii having been filed with me on the 14 day of July

1873 by Geo. O. Dennis Administrator of the
Estate of his late Majesty Kamehameha V
in accordance with the provisions of an Act to facilitate the settlement of Boundaries, &c., approved on the 22d day of June, A. D. 1868; now, therefore, having duly received and heard all the testimony offered in reference to the said boundaries and having gone on the said land, at the request of J. W. Gay acting for Geo. O. Dennis and having endeavored otherwise to obtain all information possible to enable me to arrive at a just decision, which will more fully appear by reference to the records of this matter by me kept in Book No. 1, page 47, and it appearing to my satisfaction that the true, lawful and equitable boundaries, are as follows, viz:

The Western Boundary of this land commences at a point on the sea shore on the South West point of the Wahiawa Harbour at a place known as Kemakua a which place an arch in the cliff was the sea running through it. Thence to the centre of a large pile of stones called Kukikialoa Thence to the centre of a pile of stones Omia Thence to Palikuaia Thence to Kalakaia west of some cactus bushes, and in an inclusion of stone fencing of about One Quarter of an acre

Thence to a stone inside of Rowells stone fence near gateway and called Mopunahoa Thence to Hoiaki, Thence to Puuokaluki near the corner of a house lot once occupied by the Konihiki of this land Thence to spur Keuholua, Thence to top of high peak Pohakoa, Thence along ridge to Pohakiki, Thence along ridge to clear Knoll in Bush at a Row Tree standing alone Thence along ridge to Puwanuka, Thence along ridge to the highest point of Kaplaow thence round ridge to Kahili and junction of this land with Kalahies

The Eastern Boundary of this land at sea beach at a point called Kohes at a large stone the shape of an hour glass and runs thence to a place called Owahani Thence to a place called Keahua, Thence to Puulohote a square of stones with three holes in the center Thence to Kaluakawaka, Thence to a place called Kuhawebrow, Thence to Wakakawale, Thence to Kahalekii Thence across several small gullies, and through Down of Boiling Down Estabishment and part West side of Bridge on Government road to a place called Kauaihaka where there is a large stone Thence across gully and up past stockyard to a stone with a split in it called Kaipape-aina Thence to a large rock ten feet high with a split in it this M and called Kapouma Thence on up through bush to a large tree on top of ridge and called Kapilliwahini

Thence along ridge adjoining Kalahoa to high
peak Kahili and junction with Western
Boundary.

It is therefore adjudged and I do
hereby decide and certify that the boundaries
of said land are and hereafter shall be as
hereunto set forth.

The Western Boundary of this Land commences at a point on the Sea Shore on the South West point of Wabiarra Harbor at a place known as Benakua at which place an arch in the cliff has the sea running through it. The following objects bear from 95 links from top of Pali on this boundary

Ahualiku Peak	N 44° 43' E	2260	to centre of pile of Stones called Mukekaloa, thence
Punlani Peak	N 16° 12' W		
	N 27° 48' E	2260	links to the centre of a large pile of Stones called Mukekaloa, thence
	N 16° 39' E	1847	to centre of pile of Stones called Oirivai
	N 30° 36' E	1410	to within 150 links of Pali and called Palikoaai, thence
	N 36° 53' E	9035	to place called Alalai to the west of some Carter bushes, and in an enclosure of Stone fencing of about 1/4 of an acre.
	N 47° 23' E	5753	passing at 56 1/2 links to the West of Gateway to large Stone and called Kopunatua

Thence the following objects bear Ahualiku Peak

	N 40° 13' W	4260	to Povalua Peak ahead on this boundary
	N 13° 54' E		Thence from Kopunatua
	N 28° 16' E		3900 links to Koiatui - thence
	N 14° 49' E	2800	links to place called Puokalubui - at 1700 links on this line passes the west corner of house lot once occupied by the Monohitiis of this Land.

Thence from Puuokaluhii

N 15° 10' E 3935 fms to sharp Spine leading down from
Pohakea and called Keukiolua. From thence commence-
ment of Survey at beach bears S 29° 39' N. Ahualiko Peak
N 83° 23' E

Thence from Keukiolua

N 2° 34' E 2100 fms to Pohakea there a hole has been
cut in the rocks. The Boundary runs along the ridge
to the Eastward of bearing given (see plan).

Ahualiko Peak bears S 86° 56' N, a sharp Peak on
Koakanelii and Hanapepe boundary towards Waialeale

N 1° 54' E Puukapele N 49° 48' E Meads 46.48. Thence
from Pohakea following along the ridge to a peak bearing


N 9° 10' E 1300 fms and called Pohakihii. Thence
following along ridge to a clear Knoll in the bush to a
Broa tree standing alone

N 33° 14' E 3700 fms. Thence along the ridge to the top of Puuauu

N 14° 45' E 3200 " and thence continuing along the ridge
until joining Spine leading from Kahili Peak to Waialeale


The Eastern Boundary of this land commences
at sea beach at a point called Kooheo at a large stone
the shape of an hour glass (see plan) 400 fms from beach
and runs thence N 0° 12' E Meads 1:0' N 1193 fms to a
place called Ouatani. Thence

N 10° 5' E 1799 fms to place called Keatua. Thence

N 7° 50' E 4460 " to Puuoleleole a square of
stones with three set into centre (thus )

N 2° 42' E 2567 " to place called Kaluakana
from thence bears Ahualiko Peak N 39° 29' N - Pohakea
Peak N 8° 42' N. Thence from Kaluakana

N 18° 10' E 2933 fms to place called Kukauikoo.

- N 28° 58' E 1663 links to place called *Kakakawa*
N 18° 15' E 2830 " to " "*Kavaliki*
N 17° 26' E 4690 " along crossing several small gullies and
through dam of *Boilingdown* establishment and, also past
the west side of *Bridge* on *Government Road* to place called
Kamairaka a large stone from whence near *Pohaka*
N 39° 56' W Judge *W. Bryde* flag staff N 13° 5' W a tree
in bush at head of the Survey called *Kapilimahi*
N 5° 20' E From *Kamairaka*
N 10° 54' E 3281 links crossing a gully and passing 60 links
to the Westward of the S.W. corner of old *Stack Yard* to a stone
with a split in it called *Waipapa*. Thence
N 4° 40' E 3314 links crossing a gully several times to a large
rock about 10 feet high with a split in the top (thus )
and called *Kapuna*. Thence
N 1° 30' E 7100 links on up through bush to a large tree on
top of ridge and called *Kapilimahi*. The land above
this is not accessible and without going to great expense
in cutting lines through bush, cannot be surveyed further.

The quantities therefore are computed thence from an
assumed line drawn on plan from *Kapilimahi* across
to *Punaukea*, and contains an area of $4\frac{1}{3}$ acres.

There is a considerable portion of this land owned by
Mr. Correll, but owing to bad Survey cannot be correctly
ascertained.

Surveyed on Magnetic reading var. $8^{\circ} 41'$ East

I hereby certify that the above notes are a
correct Survey of the boundary as pointed out to me and
settled by Judge *W. Bryde*, Commissioner of Boundaries
for *Hawaii*.
