JUDGMENT.

An application to decide and certify the boundaries of the Land
of Kumahai District of Hanalei Island of
Kauai having been filed with me on the 7 day of August
1873 by Charles O. Bishop

in accordance with the provisions of an Act to facilitate the settlement of Boundaries, &c., approved on the 22d day of June, A. D. 1868; now, therefore, having duly received and heard all the testimony offered in reference to the said boundaries and having gone on the said land, at the request of James W. Gay acting for Charles O. Bishop and having endeavored otherwise to obtain all information possible to enable me to arrive at a just decision, which will more fully appear by reference to the records of this matter by me kept in Book No. 1, page 34, and it appearing to my satisfaction that the true, lawful and equitable boundaries, are as follows, viz: The North Western boundary of this land commences on the sea shore at a place called Rakoholimawakai, and runs thence up the side of hill to ridge Rakohole and thence up and along ridge to a Sauhalai tree at Kaleahae. Thence along ridge to Waianae, thence to Halatree at Kaleamawakai. Thence across gulch and up ridge to a place called Kealawile. Thence up ridge to peak Moo. Thence up ridge to peak Hilele. Thence up ridge to peak Pipiwai. Thence up ridge to

Kahilao. Thence up to Keula & Kawaloa.
Thence up ridge to Waleapohakeahe. Thence
along ridge to Kawaloa, thence to Hapupuu
Thence up to Puhuea the junction of this land
with Hanalei. Thence down the Eastern Boundary
to Namolokama. Thence down to Rapaiai
Lw. Thence down to high hill Niki, thence
down to thence down to Kolopou, thence con-
tinuing down ridge to Kekauawalea. Thence
down to mang trees at Kaoo the junction
of Waiaua and Waikoko. Thence down ridge
to Ohabaupili. Thence to Oiehawakakai.
Thence down to Lepahewa, thence down to
Kalabala. Thence to sea and round to place
of commencement.

It is therefore adjudged and I do hereby
decide and certify that the boundaries of the
said land are and hereafter shall be as
herein follows set forth:

Notes of Survey of Lurnahae, situated on
the Island of Hawaii

The North East corner of this land commences on
the sea shore at a rocky point called Pahalahala, and
goes thence

1. 1; 21' m 2000 chains & 10 links crossing over the top of a
conical hill close to the beach and on to top of Spur called
Lepehu. Thence

1. 14; 16' m 370 links along the ridge, thence

1. 19; 11' m 1900 to Puuhanaawaea thence

1. 10; 58' m 3200 passing Oholupili a large prominent
stone on the Spur. Thence

1. 25. 50' m 9400 Thence

1. 1. 19' E 5820 to Keokiaraelua. Thence

1. 16. 9' N 3950 along the ridge. Thence

1. 26. 1' E 1540 up the ridge to stony peak or Knob
called Koholopuu. Thence

1. 30. 36' E 9400 to a peak called Peukroonaawaea
(appearing thus 'Q') the ridge to the west of the bearing is the boundary

1. 26; 36' E 3860 Links along the ridge to Keki or Kamalana.

1. 24. 10' E 41 chains 20 links to a peak called Kapailu

1. 36; 45' E 3240 Links to a peak called Halaulara.

1. 40; 8' 2440 to sharp peak. Thence

1. 34. 30' E 3360 to the top of Mountain Kamoolokama
Returning to place of commencement at Pahalahala,
the North East Boundary of this Land runs.

4. 75° 41' N 53° 00' Links along sandy beach and crossing river and
 on up to the top of Spur called Brolokolo. Themes
 4. 49° 52' N over the face of pale to sea shore, distance about
 100 chains. Themes from Brolokolo the boundary runs
 8. 40° 10' N 1200 links along the ridge. Themes
 8. 52° 5' N 379 . along ridge to Makai side of road crossing
 Spur. Themes
 8. 29° 20' N 479 .
 8. 41° 4' N 879 . along the ridge to place called Raaluauku
 8. 8° 28' N 964 . along ridge to Waianae
 8. 19° 36' N 11212 . along the ridge and 50 links west of some
 Raubala trees
 8. 11° 1' N 1190 . along ridge where there is a Raubala
 and a large hole called Raumuamaikai
 8. 39° 34' N 1360 . crossing a gully and over on to the point
 of Spur
 8. 41° N 120 . up Spur
 8. 31° 55' N 418 . , , ,
 8. 75° 41' N 491 .
 8. 39° 0' N 794 .
 8. 37° 16' N 961 .
 8. 16° 36' N 428 . to the top of Spur
 8. 37° 6' N 978 . up the ridge
 8. 34° 24' N 169 . to the top of Healarale
 8. 4° 28' N 3800 . to Moi (the boundary from Healarale
 follows along water shed of ridge up and round the head of
 Humahua valley and down to the beach at Raubala)
 8. 16° 34' N 3500 links to Hilele
 8. 6° 54' N 5760 . to Tepirai
 8. 5° 39' N 62440 . to Tahililoa
 8. 14° 36' N 6000 . to Heould, themes in a South

East direction along the ridge to gulch called Barraiaea. Thence up the ridge going around the gulch to a place called Malawepotakau. Thence along ridge to Kamai poa. Thence Kapupuu. Thence along the ridge to Palehua the junction with Hanalei, which is the South East corner of this land. Thence following said range of mountains in a North West direction to Tamoolokama the end of Survey, on the eastern boundary of this land, (say plain) and containing an area of Three Thousand one Hundred and Fifty acres more or less (3150 acres)

A.P. At all practicable places on this Survey and when desirable marks have been put in the ground, either a stone with broken bottle beneath or a trench with a broken bottle in the centre of them

spur called Lepahu Thence

S 74° 16' W 760 Links along the ridge, thence

S 69° 11' W 1300 " to Puuhanaukea thence

S 10° 58' W 3200 " passing Pohakupili a large prominent stone on
the spur. Thence

S 25° 50' W 2460 " thence

S 37° 6' W 978 Links up the ridge

S 84° 24' W 169 " to the top of Kealawele

S 4° 28' W 3800 " to Moi (the boundary from Kealawele follows
along water shed of ridge up and round the head
of Lumahai valley and down to the beach at
Kahalahala)

S 16° 24' W 3500 Links to Hilele

S 6° 54' W 5760 " to Pipiwai

S 5° 39' W 6440 " to Kahililoa

S 14° 36' E 5000 " to Keoula, thence in a South East direction along
the ridge to gulch called Kawaialea

Thence up the ridge going around the gulch to a place called
Kaluapohakupei. Thence along ridge to Kawailea. Thence Hapuupuu.
Thence along the ridge to Palehua the junction with Hanalei, which
is the South East corner of this Land. Thence following round range
of Mountains in a North West direction to Namoolokama the end of Survey,
on the eastern boundary of this land, (see plan) and containing an area
of Three Thousand one Hundred and Fifty acres more or less (3150 acres)
