JUDGMENT.

An application to decide and certify the Boundaries of the Land
of Waipaa District of Hanalei Island of
Kauai having been filed with me on the 21 day of August
1873 by H. A. Wedemann

in accordance with the provisions of an Act to facilitate the settlement of Boundaries, &c., approved on the 22d day of June, A. D. 1868; now, therefore, having duly received and heard all the testimony offered in reference to the said boundaries and having gone on the said land, at the request of

W. S. Wilson
and having endeavored otherwise to obtain all information possible to enable me to arrive at a just decision, which will more fully appear by reference to the records of this matter by me kept in Book No. 1, page 60, and it appearing to my satisfaction that the true, lawful and equitable boundaries, are as follows, viz:

The North Eastern Boundary of this land commences in the sea at a stone called Kalapa and from thence runs to a place on the river banks called Kapua thence across stream to a stone at foot of ridge called Makaihua, thence to top of ridge at a place called by the same name Makaihua, thence up ridge to a point called Peapa, thence up ridge to a place called Kapalakea, thence

up ridge to Junction with Leemahoe at a
place called Neki and thence to hill or
peak Peehoo-nau-wika and thence down
to Kolopuu, continuing down ridge to
Kaooa where there is an Orange Tree the
junction of Waipoo with Waikaka thence
following down a branch ridge along the
Boundary of Waikaka to a place called
Keakua, from thence down the East side
of the Waikaka Stream to sand Beach
at Keakua, thence along the beach to a
large stone in the sand called Pohakaupeia
and from thence round to place of commence-
ment.

It is therefore adjudged and I do
hereby decide and certify that the boundaries
of the said land are and hereafter shall
be as hereintofore set forth.

Notes of Survey of "Waipaa" the property
of the
Governess of Hawaii

The North East corner of this land commences at a stone on the sea beach (from whence bear, Princeville Plantation Chimney $N 71^{\circ} 18' E$ (true) $N 61.20' E$ (mag) Orange tree on ridge at Kaooa, on the Western boundary of this land $S 11^{\circ} 10' W$. Kolopuu a stony peak or knot on the West boundary of this Land $S 44.59 W$) the East boundary runs thence $S 11^{\circ} 7' E$ 401 links to a stone on the River bank at a place called 'Kapuaa' - thence $S 40^{\circ} 59' W$ 600 links crossing River & on to foot of spur at a place called 'Makaihuaa' - Thence $S 19^{\circ} 35' W$ 640 links up the face of spur to a stone let into the ground. - Thence $S 33^{\circ} 2' W$ 1290 links up spur. 'the watershed of the ridge is the boundary' - Thence $S 2.45 W$ 2080 links up the ridge to a peak called "Peapea" - Thence $S 63^{\circ} 8' W$ 1850 links up the ridge to peak - Thence $S 8^{\circ} 15' W$ 2400 links to a sharp peak - Thence $S 16^{\circ} 54' W$ 2120 links to bend in ridge to the Edge of Woods - Thence $S 5.35 W$ 4260 links up the face of spur to "Kapalekea" - Thence $S 22^{\circ} 15' E$ 1980 links - Thence $S 2^{\circ} E$ 4600 links to the top of peak called "Heki" or "Namalawa", which is a high mountain and forms the S.E. corner of this Land.

* Returning to place of commencement, the Northern boundary runs as follows, $N 69.35 W$ 1906 along sea shore - Thence $N 89^{\circ} 36' W$ 607 links along sea shore - Thence $N 55^{\circ} 44' W$ 800 lbs along shore - Thence $N 55^{\circ} 0' W$

2520 links along the shore to a stone on a point to the Eastward of small Stream & called "Keahu" - Thence N. 7° 57' W 1520 links to the large rock on the sandy beach below pali & called Pohakuopio, being the North West corner of this Land. From thence N. 82.3 E a line running out into the sea to enclose fishing right (see plan) - Returning to Keahu the Western boundary runs S 29° 51' W (true) S. 20.° 0' W (mag) 6100 links to top of point of spur called Kuahua. This line at 3230 links crosses a stream, at that place the boundary of this Land follows the Eastern bank of stream until it intersects the above line where the boundary then continues along it to "Kuahua" the stream belonging to adjoining land of Waikoko, from Kuahua the boundary runs thence S 56° 50' W 1054 links up the spur - Thence S 45° 27' W 389 links up the spur. - Thence S 73.44 W 2720 links up the spur to an Orange tree at a place called "Kaooa" on the main ridge at which place it joins the Land of Punahai - Thence S. 2° 51' E 2900 following up water shed of ridge to "Keakiawailua" - Thence S 16° 9' W 3950 links along ridge - Thence S. 26° 6' E 1540 links following up ridge to stony knot or peak called "Kobopuu" - Thence S. 30° 36' E 9460 links to a peak called Puhoonauwekia (and looks thus ) the water shed of the ridge to the west of bearing is the boundary - Thence S 81.36 E 3860 links to Neki or Kamalawa the South East corner of this Land, and containing an Area One Thousand four Hundred and Eighty Six Acres.

At all practicable places and where found necessary marks
have been put in the ground. Either Stone & Bottle or
trench and bottle appearing thus 

The readings recorded are from true meridian. The
Variation being at N.E. corner of Waiale on the beach $9^{\circ} 2' E$.

portion of the Land is suitable for grazing purposes, and the
wood Land for fire wood. The Land is well watered & its
frontage on the sea offers immediate facilities for shipping its
product.

I should say One Third of the Land is wooded but rather hard
to get at, being upon the ridges and sides of mountains.
