CERTIFICATE OF BOUNDARIES

Land of: K O U L A

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Decision rendered: Nov. 14, 1873

Thence up and along the East side of an old  
Hoau or place of worship called Moloku, Thence  
up and along ridge to Kuapoo I, Thence down  
face of gulch to a round hole in ground  
Kuapoo II Thence across bottom of gulch and  
up to a high peak called Manuia, Thence  
along ridge to an old pathway and down face  
or side of hill to a mound called Puomana-  
wahi, Thence round face of ridge to Kalau  
and thence up and along side ridge to a water  
fall called Haalulu, Thence up and along  
west side of stream to Olouawahi and thence  
up ridge to a point on the Mabaweli  
range called Puulehew which terminates  
the Western boundary of this land.

From Puulehew the N + NE bound-  
ary runs down and along a well defined  
ridge to Wailima and Thence along same  
ridge to Puonawahi Thence along ridge  
to Kaplowa, Thence along ridge Kulua  
Thence to and across gulch Kapaliki to a  
peak or hill called Puouka, Thence down  
ridge to a small round rise Puouka Kai  
where the Boundary of this land joins that of  
G. B. Rowell, Thence down along said Rowell's  
land to a rock on edge of Ipali above and  
south of Koula House called Papakea, Thence  
down to a split stone near said house called  
Kahurani and thence across Koula stream  
and round corner of stone wall enclosing

Rals Lands to place of commencement.

It is therefore adjudged and I do hereby decide and certify that the boundaries of the said land are and hereafter shall be as hereunto set forth.

Thereupon appointed the 12 day of November A. D. 10 A.M. for the hearing of said petition at Koula House Hanapepe. (12 Nov) The petitioner appeared and called the following witness

I. Kauai Sworn

Kuapuu Sworn

My name is Kuapuu live in Koula born here know boundary of Koula, Nakuahanai told me he was born and dies on the land, This boundary commences at a place near stream called Kalapunahai and thence over stream and along Kalo patches to a stone called Kahunaone thence up and around by Kahaha to a peak joining Wahiawa at a peak called Puuao thence to a hill called Puuaouka, thence across gulch to Kapaleoko, thence to Puuananahu, thence along ridge and cliffs above falls to a place called Wailimu thence to a gulch at Junction with manauahi called Olonawehe thence to Manuea thence to an old Heau Maloku thence to Puukuanui, thence down ridge to Puukuaiwa, thence to Puukuawalu, thence to Puukuahiko, thence to Puukuaona thence to Puukualima, thence to Puukuakolu, thence to Puukualua thence to Pukuakahi, and thence to Kalapunahai the place of commencement.

Several other witnesses were examined and from them evidence and the above the following decision was rendered.

DECISION

Commencing at or near a stone on lower part of ridge near to the Manauahi stream and called Kalapunahai and thence running up ridge to a small hill called Puukuakahi thence up ridge to Puukualua, thence up ridge to Puukuakolu thence up ridge to Puukuaha, thence up ridge to Puukuelima, thence up ridge to Puukuaono, thence up ridge to Puukuahiku, thence up ridge to Puukuawalu, thence up ridge to Puukuaiwa, thence up ridge to Puukuaumi thence up to and along the east side of an old Heau a place of Worship called Moloku, thence up and along ridge to Kuapoo I. Thence down face of gulch to a round hole in ground Kuapoo 2, thence across bottom of gulch and up to a high peak called Manuia. Thence along ridge to an old pathway and down face or side of hill to a mound called Buomanauahi, thence round face of ridge to Kalae, and thence up and along said ridge to a water fall called Haalulu thence up and along west

side of stream to Olonawehe and thence up ridge to a point on the Makaweli range called Puulehua which terminates the western boundary of this land from Puulehua, the N. & N.E. boundary runs down and along, a well defined ridge, to Wailima, and thence along same ridge to Puononahu, Thence along ridge to Kapaloa, thence along ridge Halua, thence to and across gulch, Kapalioki to a peak or hill called Puouka thence down ridge to a small round rise called Puoukakai where the boundary of this land, joins that of G. B. Rowell thence down along said Rowell's land, to a rock on edge of pali above and south of Koula house called Papakia thence down to a split stone near said house called Kahunaone, and thence across Koula stream and round corner of stone wall enclosing Kalo patches to place of commencement

 and Manuahi thence from Mauaea N 30.8W 2200 along the ridge this is as  
 far as it is advisable to carry the survey, position beyond this the land  
 is rough and thickly wooded but by the following description and reference  
 to accompanying plan, at any future time the boundary by survey can be  
 more definitely stated, the boundary from 2200 links true <sup>runs</sup> / round the  
 side of range above the pali to the south end of the Kalala ridge  
 thence along the water shed of Kalala ridge to its north end thence N  
 down to the S.W. side of stream, and then continuing up the west bank  
 of stream to Haalulu Waterfall, thence along west, bank of stream to a  
 place called Olonawahi from thence up a ridge leading to the top of Puu-  
 lehua the North end of Manuaho. Thence following along the ridge in a  
 N.E. direction towards Waialeale to where a ridge branches off and runs



in a S.E. direction towards ~~Ka~~hi from thence in about S. E. direction to a round hill in the saddle called Wailama thence in a S. E. direction along ridge to Puuananahu. Thence along ridge to a high sharp peak called Kapaloa which is the N. W. corner of Wahiawa and N. E. corner of this land.

Return to place of commencement the eastern boundary of this land runs thus S 59. 23E 354 links across the Koula stream to a large split stone at the point of the Koula house and called Kahunao-ne, thence S. 62<sup>o</sup> 45' E 450 links to the top of rocky point called Papakea, thence N. 55. 25E 360 links along ridge, thence N. 84<sup>o</sup> 59'E 665 links up ridge to Mr. Rowells land, thence N. 26<sup>o</sup> 10' E 4200<sup>along</sup> the face of hill to a point called Kahaha N. 89<sup>o</sup> E 4700 links up the hill to the top of Puuaukai bounded on the south by Mr. Rowells land, thence N. 17<sup>o</sup> 45' E 3200 to the top of Puuauka bounded on the East by Wahiawa, thence N. 38<sup>o</sup> 30' E 120.00 links to the top of a peak on ridge called Hulua thence N. 44<sup>o</sup> 45'E 7000 lks to the top of a sharp peak at the N. W. corner of Wahiawa and called Kapaloa, which is the N. E. corner of this land

From Puuaukai, the boundary between this land and Wahiawa is the watershed of the ridge (see Plan)

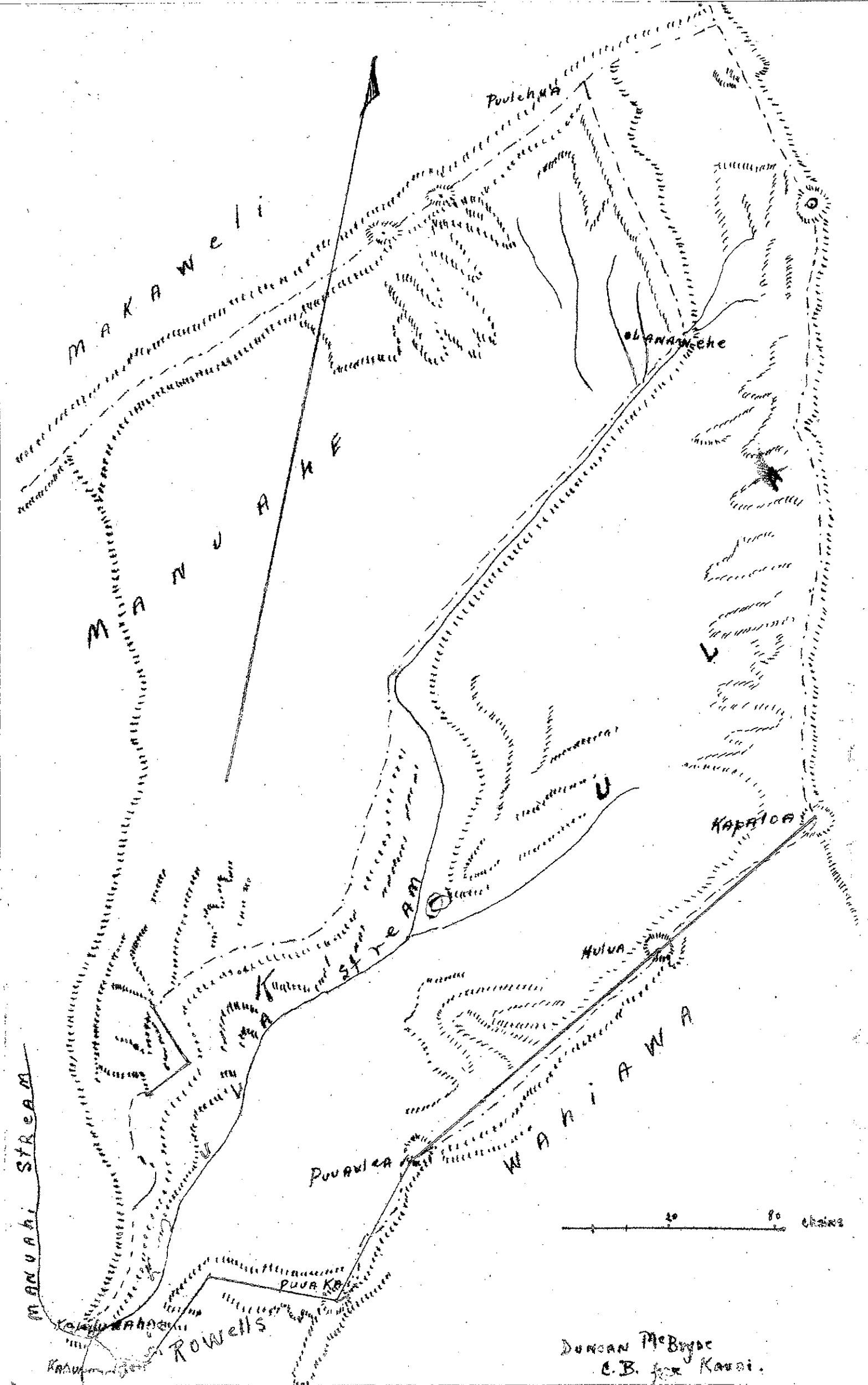
