JUDGMENT.

An application to decide and certify the Boundaries of the Land
of Manuahi District of Waimea Island of
Kauai having been filed with me on the 30 day of April
1873 by C. B. Bishop

in accordance with the provisions of an Act to facilitate the settlement of Boundaries, &c., approved on the 22d day of June, A. D. 1868; now, therefore, having duly received and heard all the testimony offered in reference to the said boundaries and having gone on the said land, at the request of

James W. Gay
and having endeavored otherwise to obtain all information possible to enable me to arrive at a just decision, which will more fully appear by reference to the records of this matter by me kept in Book No. 1, page 70, and it appearing to my satisfaction that the true, lawful and equitable boundaries, are as follows, viz:

The Boundary of this land commences at its North East corner at the junction of Koula and Manuahi streams and thence thence along the North side of Manuahi stream to foot of spur at a place called Kalapuna has thence up to top of Knoll called Puu Kuahahi thence up along ridge to old Heau said Heau being in Manuahi thence up edge of Pale and through Guava Bushes to open grass lot. Thence down side of hill

to hole called Kuapoo. Thence crossing gully
and up to high peaks in bush called Puu-
manuahi. Thence along ridge Kalae and
down to the west side of Waterfall called
Uaalule Thence along west bank of stream
to a place called Olanauehi. Thence up a
ridge running in a westerly direction to
top of Peak called Puuhehua the W.W.
corner of this land

The south Boundary runs along
the bank of the Kawapepe stream to a place
called Waipahu. Thence up face of Pale and
on up ridge to Koepala and thence on to
Koakaha at which place this town joins
Wakawale. Thence the Boundary follows
Wakawale along water shed of ridge to
Kakapa Thence to Kukuaile Thence on from
Peak to Peak on ridge till its junction with
the Eastern Boundary at Puuhehua

It is therefore adjudged and
I do hereby decide and certify that the boundaries
of the said land are and hereafter shall be as
herewith set forth

Notes of Survey of Hamrahi by James W. Gay

The property of the King Bernalibo.

The survey commences at its South East corner at the junction of Koubu and Murrabri stream and runs thence

 of this land and its junction with Makaneli & Koula N 19° 30' E (true)
 Pohaleas Peak S 5° 31' E (true), Anuileku Peak S 34° 42' W
 (true), Thence from Manua N 39° 8' W. (N 21° 45' W true)
 2200 Pinks along ridge through bush to the end of
 survey above this the land is of no value and very difficult of
 access, and without cutting lines through the bush a continu-
 ation of the survey would be impossible. The following names
 of places are those given by the Hamaiaina Anapuu, on
 whose evidence the boundary was settled from Manua along
 side of hill to place called Tur manuahi, thence along
 ridge Kalai and down to the west side of Waterfall
 Maalulu thence along the west bank of the stream to a
 place called Opanaichi, thence up a ridge running in
 a westerly direction to top of peak called Puulehua the
 North West corner of this land.

Returning to place of commencement at junction
 of Manuahi and Koula streams, the south boundary
 runs along Hanapepe in the following bearing & distances

as far as possible survey is carried. The boundary however continues along the watershed of ridge to following places Puhemakane, Kakanakakerralu, Peapeamainui, Amokui, Kewahua, Kralawa and Pulehura, the North West corner of this land and containing an area of 86 1/2 acres. At all the necessary stations on the survey there are good marks, such as a stone set into the ground.

The whole of this land is very rough but what is accessible is well grassed and excellent grazing.
