JUDGMENT.

An application to decide and certify the Boundaries of the Land  
of Namalamalo District of Koolau Island of  
Hawaii having been filed with me on the 15 day of September  
1873 by Edwin O. Hall Minister of Interior

in accordance with the provisions of an Act to facilitate the settlement of Boundaries, &c., approved on the 22d day of June, A. D. 1868; now, therefore, having duly received and heard all the testimony offered in reference to the said boundaries and having gone on the said land, at the request of

Henry Snow agent for Government Lands  
and having endeavored otherwise to obtain all information possible to enable me to arrive at a just decision, which will more fully appear by reference to the records of this matter by me kept in Book No. \_\_\_\_\_, page \_\_\_\_\_, and it appearing to my satisfaction that the true, lawful and equitable boundaries, are as follows, viz:

Commencing at the west side of an opening in the reef adjoining Anahola and called Papalou where there is a large erosion made in side of bank immediately above the sand beach and from thence running westerly to a clump of stones or rocks called Kalepou and thence continuing through open plain to Apulea a lot of stones near Naniho which latter place is in Namalamalo, thence to where the road crosses a small hollow Pohu-pohuki, thence to where there used to be a

settlement of houses in olden times called Ka-  
leabawale Thence through a large basin or  
pond in small stream one half of which belongs  
to Kamalamale and the other half to Anahola  
said basin or pond is called Mamiasiole  
from thence up small ridge, and on to plain to  
a place called Kamabaiwa and thence through  
open space to Peekavaapeu, thence continuing  
through open plain or flat to its junction with  
the wood at a place called Kalheakamalii  
Thence along old road through wood to the west  
corner of a small ridge immediately above the  
the Anahola River and called Peawa  
Thence following round said ridge to Keakini  
and thence up through forest to a large gulch  
or gorge represented to be in Elidilwa and  
dug out by Kailianouhaumeu at this gorge  
the western Boundary of Kamalamale termin-  
ates by junction with the Boundaries of Ka-  
libuab, Anahole, and Kealia and from  
thence it runs down the western Boundary  
of Kealia to the sea

It is therefore adjudged and I do hereby  
decide and certify that the Boundaries of  
the said land are and here after shall be  
as hereinbefore set forth
