JUDGMENT.

An application to decide and certify the boundaries of the Land
of Kamalama District of Koolau Island of
Hawaii having been filed with me on the 15 day of September
1873 by Edwin O. Hall Minister of Interior

in accordance with the provisions of an Act to facilitate the settlement of Boundaries, &c., approved on the 22d day of June, A. D. 1868; now, therefore, having duly received and heard all the testimony offered in reference to the said boundaries and having gone on the said land, at the request of

Henry Johnson agent for Government and having endeavored otherwise to obtain all information possible to enable me to arrive at a just decision, which will more fully appear by reference to the records of this matter by me kept in Book No., page, and it appearing to my satisfaction that the true, lawful and equitable boundaries, are as follows, viz: Commencing at the west side of an opening in the reef adjoining Onahola and called Papaloa where there is a large cove made in side of bank immediately above the sand beach and from thence running northward to a clump of stones or rocks called Kalepa and thence continuing through open plain to Apolu a lot of stones near Nanilo which latter place is in Kamalama, thence to where the road crosses a small hollow Pohopohoki, thence to where there used to be a

settlement of houses in olden times called Ra-
leahawale. Then through a large basin or
pond in small stream on half of which belongs
to Ramalawale and the other half to Anahola.
said basin or pond is called Mamaekole
from thence up small ridge, and on to plain to
a place called Ramahawale and thence through
open space to Peeukawaapew, then continuing
through open plain or flat to its junction with
the wood at a place called Kallukwakwalee.
Then along old road through wood to the west
corner of a small ridge immediately above the
the Anahola River and called Puawa.
Then following round said ridge to Reahini
and thence up through forest to a large gulch
or gorge represented to be in Glikilow and
dug out by Railianwahamee at this gorge.
The Western Boundary of Ramalawale terminates
by junction with the Boundaries of Ra-
leahawale, Anahola, and Peahala and from
thence it runs down the western Boundary
of Peahala to the sea.

It is therefore adjudged and I do hereby
decide and certify that the Boundaries of
the said land are and here after shall be
as hereinbefore set forth
