JUDGMENT.

An application to decide and certify the Boundaries of the Land  
of Anahola District of Koolau Island of  
Kauai having been filed with me on the 14 day of July  
1873 by Geo. O. Dennis Crown Commissioner  
and Land agent

in accordance with the provisions of an Act to facilitate the settlement of Boundaries, &c., approved on the 22d day of June, A. D. 1868; now, therefore, having duly received and heard all the testimony offered in reference to the said boundaries and having gone on the said land, at the request of  
W. S. Wilson acting for Crown Comm<sup>r</sup>  
and having endeavored otherwise to obtain all information possible to enable me to arrive at a just decision, which will more fully appear by reference to the records of this matter by me kept in Book No. 1, page 94, and it appearing to my satisfaction that the true, lawful and equitable boundaries, are as follows, viz:

Commencing in the West corner  
of this land on the sea shore at a stony  
place where there was formerly a place of  
worship called Kuachu and thence up towards  
mountain to a resting place on the plains  
called Akole thence to a ridge in face of  
hill Kaahakolekole thence following up  
ridge to top of hill Ripoo thence to a  
point on hill called Kauweraumakua  
thence up ridge to Pulu, thence up ridge  
to Pukeakua thence to where an old road

formerly crossed from Kealia to Kilauea  
called Keaioa thence to high peaks,  
Malamalamaiki thence to three peaks the  
Boundary running over the two highest,  
Namahana thence to Kolemukau or Kaw  
muku thence to deep gulch or gorge in  
Eliililoa by Kaibambakuumu where Ana-  
hala joins with Kamalamalo Kealia and  
Kakihawai. The Eastern Boundary then  
commences and runs down along side of  
Kamalamalo through wood to a place called  
Kuakini and thence round on small ridge  
to mark this + at Puawa and thence  
through wood to a large open plain or  
flat Kalehuakamali thence continuing  
through open plain or flat to Peehawaapeu  
thence to Kamakaua thence to a large  
basin or pond called Mamakaua one  
half of which belongs to Anahola and one  
half to Kamalamalo, and thence to an old  
settlement of houses called Kalukawele  
thence to a small hollow where road crosses  
called Pohopohoiki thence to Apuhu a  
lot of stones near Nanihu (which latter place  
is in Kamalamalo) thence to a clump  
of stones or rocks called Kalioa thence  
to Papalou an opening in the reef, the  
opening in the reef belongs to Kamalamalo

It is therefore adjudged and I do  
hereby decide and certify that the boundaries  
of the said land are and hereafter shall be

as heretofore set forth

The S.E. corner of this land commences at the sea shore at a

stone at a place called Bruacher and runs thence

Where the lines on plan are only dotted thus - - - - - it signifies that the ridge of hills is the boundary, but when drawn in full, the line is to be taken as the boundary. The bearings herein recorded are on the true Meridian of Poo Farm Kamihiri.

At all the stations outside of the woods there has been stones set and marked thus ↑
