JUDGMENT.

Upon application to decide and certify the boundaries of the Land
of Hanakapi'ai District of Hanalei Island of
Kauai having been filed with me on the 15 day of November
1873 by Edwin O. Hall Minister of Interior

in accordance with the provisions of an Act to facilitate the settlement of Boundaries, &c., approved on the 22d day of June, A. D. 1868; now, therefore, having duly received and heard all the testimony offered in reference to the said boundaries and having gone on the said land, at the request of Henry Johnston agent for government lands and having endeavored otherwise to obtain all information possible to enable me to arrive at a just decision, which will more fully appear by reference to the records of this matter by me kept in Book No. 1, page 110, and it appearing to my satisfaction that the true, lawful and equitable boundaries, are as follows, viz: The Boundary of this land commences on the sea shore at a place called Waikoaana and thence to a place called Ko'olewa thence to a ridge called Laukaa, thence up ridge to point on hill at a place called Namaniamana, thence following up same ridge to point on hill called Pookoko thence up ridge to Peak called Puanui, thence up same ridge to Peak Kalapahalulu thence up ridge to Alu'ini, the furthest point of Haina and the junction of this land with

Wainiha thence continuing up along Wainiha to a peak Haha thence up through forest to peak Waiau, thence to Alakai the highest point on Eastern Boundary. thence round the head of this land to Hapsiaa the commencement of Western Boundary thence down Western Boundary to a cave in cliff called Halehula thence down to Peak Koooa thence continuing down ridge to Peak Pohaku akani, thence down ridge to Peak Pohekaa thence to peak on ridge Hoolulu thence to a rock where the gods used to meet and called Kaiua thence to a trickling stream on the sea shore and called Waipuuahaea, and thence round to place of commencement.

It is therefore adjudged and I do hereby decide and certify that the boundaries of the said land are and hereafter shall be as hereinbefore set forth
