JUDGMENT.

An application to decide and certify the Boundaries of the Land  
of Hanokoa District of Hanalei Island of  
Kauai having been filed with me on the 13 day of September  
1873 by Edwin O. Hall Minister of Interior

in accordance with the provisions of an Act to facilitate the settlement of Boundaries, &c., approved on the 22d day of June, A. D. 1868; now, therefore, having duly received and heard all the testimony offered in reference to the said boundaries and having gone on the said land, at the request of Henry Johnson agent for Gov. Lands and having endeavored otherwise to obtain all information possible to enable me to arrive at a just decision, which will more fully appear by reference to the records of this matter by me kept in Book No. 1, page 113, and it appearing to my satisfaction that the true, lawful and equitable boundaries, are as follows, viz:

The Western part of this land belongs to Government the centre or middle to a native called Mokuahai and the Eastern part known as an ili by the name of Wailoa also to Government the Ili joins Hanalei on the sea shore at a place called Waipunahoa and from there to a stone called Kailua, thence to a point on the bluff called Hoolulu thence to a point on bluff Pohakoa. Thence to an old place of residence of natives where

there were Kalo lands at Waiaha and  
thence round in a westerly direction to Wai-  
ahuakua thence up a ridge called Mooalele  
to stream and Kalo lands called Waiiaa, thence  
to highest point of Boundary at a place called  
Keanaouka, thence to where this land joins  
the Boundary of the Ahupuaa of Pohakoua  
at a place called Kahui thence down along  
side of Pohakoua Boundary to an old battle  
field called Kalehua thence down ridge called  
Kalwaipapa to valley of the same name, thence  
down valley and stream to a rock in the sea  
a short distance from the shore resembling a  
shark the boundary runs over said rock  
tradition giving the head to Pohakoua and  
the tail to Hanabroo said rock is called  
Pohakoukimanoo

It is therefore adjudged and I  
do hereby decide and certify that the boundaries  
of the said land are and hereafter shall be  
as hereunto set forth.
