JUDGMENT.

An application to decide and certify the boundaries of the Land
of Hanokoa District of Hanalei Island of
Hawaii having been filed with me on the 13 day of September
1873 by Edwin O. Hall Minister of Interior

in accordance with the provisions of an Act to facilitate the settlement of Boundaries, &c., approved on the 22d day of June, A. D. 1868; now, therefore, having duly received and heard all the testimony offered in reference to the said boundaries and having gone on the said land, at the request of

Henry Johnson agent for John L. and
and having endeavored otherwise to obtain full information possible to enable
me to arrive at a just decision, which will more fully appear by reference to the
records of this matter by me kept in Book No. 1, page 113, and it
appearing to my satisfaction that the true, lawful and equitable boundaries,
are as follows, viz:

The Western part of this land belongs to
Government the centre or middle to a native
called Mokuahai and the Eastern part known
as an ili by the name of Waipoo also to
Government The Ili joins Hanakapai on the
sea shore at a place called Waipumaha and
from thence to a stone called Hailua, thence
to a point on the cliff called Hoolulu
thence to a point on cliff Ohabea. There
is an old place of residence of natives where

there were Kalo lands at Waiahu and
thence round in a Westerly direction to Wai-
ahauhau thence up a ridge called Mooalele
to stream and Kalo lands called Waitaa, thence
to highest point of Boundary at a place called
Keanapouka. thence to where this land joins
the Boundary of the Ahupeua of Pohakauw
at a place called Rahui. thence down along
side of Pohakauw Boundary to an old battle
field called Ralehuu thence down ridge called
Kalaisapa to valley of the same name. thence
down valley and stream to a rock in the sea
a short distance from the shore resembling a
shark the boundary runs over said rock
tradition giving the head to Pohakauw and
the tail to Hanatoo said rock is called
Pohakuhimano

It is therefore adjudged and I
do hereby decide and certify that the boundaries
of the said land are and hereafter shall be
as hereinbefore set forth.
