JUDGMENT.

An application to decide and certify the boundaries of the Land
of Kalalau District of Hanalei, Island of
Kauai having been filed with me on the 15 day of September
1873 by Edwin O Hall

in accordance with the provisions of an Act to facilitate the settlement of Boundaries, &c., approved on the 22d day of June, A. D. 1868; now, therefore, having duly received and heard all the testimony offered in reference to the said boundaries and having gone on the said land, at the request of

Henry Johnstone and having endeavored otherwise to obtain all information possible to enable me to arrive at a just decision, which will more fully appear by reference to the records of this matter by me kept in Book No. 1, page 11 $\frac{1}{2}$ and it appearing to my satisfaction that the true, lawful and equitable boundaries, are as follows, viz:

The North East boundary of this land commences on the sea shore at a place called Nauakai, and thence runs up face of mountain to a place where the gods used to have sacrifices offered to them called Kahuiwhakew thence to a resting place called Kauakow thence to high peak called Punki thence to high peak Koalahewa thence to the highest peak on Eastern Boundary called Alalealau, thence round ridge to Kaala thence round ridge to Kahoolau

Thence to ridge about centre of valley Haa-
puni. Thence to junction with Wainia at
Pihia Thence along Wainia Boundary to Aia-
nui continuing along Wainia Boundary to
Kawailow, and along same Boundary to Puu-
ohila and from thence to a large and particularly
shaped rock each side representing a hand &
called Pohakiuwaawa at this rock the Bound-
ary of Wainia terminates with this land
and this land then joins the Boundary of
Honopuu and Nuulolo. From Pohakiuwaawa
the Boundary runs to face of cliff Kalalau
Thence to high peak with round hole through
top called Keanapukia Thence down pre-
cipice to Kalalau. Thence to Peak Waikumu
Thence down to sea shore at Kalalau and
from thence round to place of commencement
It is therefore adjudged and I do
hereby decide and certify that the boundaries
of said land are and here after shall be
as heretofore set forth
