JUDGMENT.

An application to decide and certify the boundaries of the Land
of Rikigala District of Wainoa Island of
Kauai having been filed with me on the 8 day of May
1873 by Naldmar Noredsen

in accordance with the provisions of an Act to facilitate the settlement of Boundaries, &c., approved on the 22d day of June, A. D. 1868; now, therefore, having duly received and heard all the testimony offered in reference to the said boundaries and having gone on the said land, at the request of

records of this matter by me kept in Book No. ..., page 129, and it appearing to my satisfaction that the true, lawful and equitable boundaries, are as follows, viz: This Boundary being contested, by G. B. Powell on behalf of the Crown Commissioners, the Commission of Boundaries after two days hearing finds for the petition in regard to the disputed land between the old Aiuai and the Palei, said land belongs to Rikigala, The commission also finds that the Kula land surrounding Mr. Powell's land and the church land belongs to Rikigala with the fishing right pertaining to the same. The boundary of this land commences

at a stone called Pohakalani and from there
to the Pali (including three Rapapatches)
thence the Boundary follows the top of the
Pali down to the sea of Kapapaonanaw near
Mr Knudsen's rice house thence out to sea at
edge of reef at a place called Kuahelii thence
along reef to a place opposite to Kihiau thence
marked to a stone at foot of pali. and then
along foot of pali to place of commencement.

It is therefore adjudged and I
do hereby decide and certify that the boundaries
of the said land are and hereafter shall be
as hereinbefore set forth:

Survey of the Land of
Kikiaola, Waimea, Kauai.

Commencing at the West corner of this land at a red-wood post on sand hill at sea, from which post the spire of the old Protestant church bears S 85° 30' E true and the Kekaha Mill chimney bears N 57° 57' W true and running:

2. Thence along Pali along Pokii to a cross on a stone at rocky point a little above the end of a stone wall the direct bearing and distance being S 72° 7' E true 8963. feet;
3. S. 56° 29' E true 2002.00 feet along Pokii to a cross cut on a stone at the edge of the Waimea Valley;
4. N. 13° 30' E true 1236.00 feet along Pokii along edge of Pali; Thence
5. N. 12° 24' W true 2207.0 feet along Pokii up ridge to a stone marked thus →; Thence
6. S. 77° 49' E true 2267.0 feet along Pokii to a rock at edge of pali; Thence
7. East true 317 feet along Pokii to a cross cut on a stone at edge of the Waimea River and just above a rock in the river called Bahakalani
8. S. 11° 48' E true 318 feet along Pali;
9. S. 4° 22' W true 214 feet along Waimea to the boundary;
10. S. 25° 11' W true 1283.00 feet;
11. N. 56° 00' W true 947 feet along Waimea to Pali;
12. Thence following along the foot of the pali along Waimea to a path leading up said pali at a place called Kalokaa the boundary goes up this path to a rock marked with a cross at edge of pali. The direct bearing from last point being S 30° 45' W. true 2772.0 feet.
13. S 21° 38' W true 1076 feet along Waimea along edge of pali.
14. S 42° 00' W true 409.0 feet along Waimea along edge of pali to a point that bears S 41° 3' E true 129 feet from the transit of Venus station;
15. S 54° 26' W true 403.0 feet along Waimea along edge of pali;
16. S 73° 37' W true 653.0 feet along Waimea along edge of pali and across "Government Road to a point at angle of stone wall;
17. S 26° 9' W true 104.0 feet along Waimea to angle of stone wall;
18. S 62° 31' W true 205.0 feet along Waimea to rock at sea shore the wharf and marked with a cross. From this rock the spire of the old Protestant church bears N. 14° 18' E true and the transit of Venus meridian mark bears N 8° 22' E true;
19. Thence following along the seashore to initial point the direct bearing being N 78° 4' W true 9553 feet.

Lele of Kikiola in Waimea Valley, consisting of three taro patches. Commencing at the East corner of this lele which point bears S. $80^{\circ} 15'$ E. true 707.0 feet from the stone marked thus ← on edge of pali at place called Kalokaa at path and running:

1. S. $30^{\circ} 30'$ W. true 129. feet along Kuauna along Waimea;
2. S. $46^{\circ} 3'$ W. true 132.5 feet along Kuauna along Waimea;
3. N. $45^{\circ} 57'$ W. true 125.0 feet along Kuauna along Waimea;
4. N. $21^{\circ} 00'$ E. true 50.0 feet along same;
