JUDGMENT.

An application to decide and certify the Boundaries of the Land
of Nahili District of Molokai Island of
Kauai having been filed with me on the 210 day of August
1874 by Charles W. Bishop agent for his
Majesty Lunalilo

in accordance with the provisions of an Act to facilitate the settlement of Boundaries, &c., approved on the 22d day of June, A. D. 1868; now, therefore, having duly received and heard all the testimony offered in reference to the said boundaries and having gone on the said land, at the request of

Henry Johnston,
and having endeavored otherwise to obtain all information possible to enable me to arrive at a just decision, which will more fully appear by reference to the records of this matter by me kept in Book No. 1, page 20, and it appearing to my satisfaction that the true, lawful and equitable boundaries, are as follows, viz:

Commencing on the sea shore at a place called Manuhonui ledge of rocks and thence to top of ridge called Piukuaiki thence down side or face of hill to a blow in the river near the edge, and called Koaula thence up alongside of right bank of river to Aiho, thence up same side of river to a large kalo patch called Kalawai, thence following up same side of river to a kalo tree called Poako, thence up river to Kalopatch called Kamalohale, thence up same side to

Kalopateh and Hala tree. Kukuilalani. Thence
up same side to stones near area Kalo Hoolohi
mei continuing up same side to area Kalo called
Wahuaokoohi. Thence up below stony ledge
to past rapids of river Pohakiki, thence across
river to stones close to bank called Raneawahi
Thence runs up hill through stony and rocky
ground to pihala grove called Pohakupu
Thence up to edge of stony brow Kukuiinu. Thence
Thence up ridge through pihala trees to a short
distance above small bridge on Government road
Puuananua, Thence up ridge and across gulch
to Kapuhale, Thence through a small stream
called by the same name to a broad Kula land
called Wailalaau Thence up through forest
to a stone called Kamalawaionohi Thence up
ridge to Kalaupala. The boundary then
turns in a southerly direction to Puauakea
and thence down Eastern Boundary to Water
fall Waihipototei Thence to stones Pohaku
waawaa, Thence to large Kukuiinu Pohaku
elele Thence to small stream Pukohiki Thence
to main tree gulch and stream below ridge
Kaluanawaka, Thence to old residing places
Pahulenu, Thence to ridge above small stream
near Government road to Puuanui, Thence
through Western side of a large Kalopateh
Kulihali, Thence to near a mound where there
was formerly a schoolhouse and called Kaula
Thence down ridge to Kaiwa and thence to a
place where offerings used to be made called
Coakahu, this place is in Kaiwa, Thence

to Koa's rocks on sea shore and thence out and round up to place of commencement. —

It is therefore adjudged and I do hereby decide and certify that the boundaries of the said land are and hereafter shall be as heretofore set forth

Previous to deciding the boundary of this land I could not learn from Mr. Sitcomb whether he had a Royal Patent for the adjoining land

of Kilauea or not, he refusing to give me any information on that point, afterwards but not until I had rendered my decision I learned from Mr. James Gay, that there was a Royal patent for Kilauea, that he had seen it in said Titcomb's possession, if such is the case then my decision regarding the Western Boundary must be considered void if conflicting with the Royal Patent.

L.C.Award 8559-B, Ap. 38, to W. C. Lunalilo.

Beginning at a granite post on the cliff at seashore, Northwest of the mouth of the Kahili Stream. From the above granite post the Government Survey Trig. Station "Kamoku" (on a hill in the land of Pilaa) bears by true azimuth $345^{\circ} 32'$ and running by true azimuths:-

1. $1^{\circ} 45'$ 917.0 feet along Kilauea Grant 2896 to C. Titcomb, down slope and across road to landing to a cross cut on a rocky point on edge of Kahili Stream;
2. $320^{\circ} 29'$ 1149.0 feet along Kilauea to a granite post at foot of Lauhala tree on East side of Kahili Stream;
3. $10^{\circ} 12'$ 330.0 feet along Kilauea to a granite post at foot of Lauhala tree on East side of Kahili Stream;
4. $82^{\circ} 17'$ 2094.0 feet along Kilauea to a large black rock marked thus  on the North edge of Kahili Stream;
5. $32^{\circ} 43'$ 3065.0 feet along Kilauea passing a little East of two cocconut trees and up side of gulch to a granite post on edge of gulch. From the above granite post "Kamoku" Trig. Station is by true azimuth $319^{\circ} 27'$ 9625.0 feet;
6. $9^{\circ} 45'$ 18633.0 feet along Kilauea to top of peak called Kalau-pala. On this line there are two granite posts set, one a little mauka of the Government Road and the other near foot of the mountain;
7. $2^{\circ} 15'$ 3020.0 feet to top of peak called Leleiwi;

Ahupuaa of Kahili,
Koolau, Kauai.

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8. 203° 47' 14814.0 feet along the land of Papaa to a stone marked thus → on the top of a hill called Puu Pane. From this stone 'Kamoku' Trig. Station is by true azimuth 261° 48' 3613.0 feet;
9. 193° 30' 9207.0 feet along the land of West Waiakalua L.C. Award 11216 to Kekauonohi to a stone marked thus → at a place called Kulihalli. From this stone 'Kamoku' Trig. Station is by true azimuth 350° 23' 8551.0 feet;
10. 222° 50' 2245.0 feet along West Waiakalua to a stone marked with a cross;
11. 220° 44' 590.0 feet along West Waiakalua to a stone marked thus → on top of ridge;
12. 210° 40' 340.0 feet along West Waiakalua down side of hill to a cross cut on a rocky point at sea called Kaiwa;
13. Thence following along the seashore at high water mark around Makole point to initial point. The direct azimuth and distance being 110° 56' 4119.0 feet.

The above survey was made in accordance with the evidence of Kapule (k) a Kamaaina and line agreed upon by Capt. John Ross and Chas. Titcomb between Kilauea and Kahili. Ross for Kilauea and Titcomb for Kahili.
