DECISION, AND CERTIFICATE OF BOUNDARIES.

On this 14th day of April 1905, at Lihue, Island of Kauai, in the Territory of Hawaii, I, Jacob Hardy, the undersigned Commissioner of boundaries for the Fifth Judicial Circuit of said Territory, having heard the petition of A.S. Wilcox and the Princeville Plantation Company, an Hawaiian Corporation, (as said petition was amended by leave of said Commissioner at said hearing) for the settlement of the boundaries of the Ahupuaas of Kalihiwai and Kalihikai, in the District of Halelea, in said Fifth Judicial Circuit, Island of Kauai, in accordance with the description and survey therefor as claimed by said petitioner, Princeville Plantation Company;

And due and legal notice of said hearing having been by said Commissioner duly given by advertisement as required by law;

And said Commissioner having at said hearing received all of the testimony and proofs offered with respect to the boundaries of said lands; and also having received and considered as a part of the evidence in said matter, the testimony adduced in a certain proceeding for the settlement of the boundaries of said Ahupuaa of Kalihiwai on November 22, 1877, before the Honorable Duncan McBryde, then Commissioner of Boundaries for said wifth Judicial Circuit;

And said Commissioner having endeavored to obtain all information possible to enable him to arrive at a just decision as to the boundaries of said lands;

And at said hearing on said 14th day of april 1905, the Kilauea Sugar Company having been represented by Andrew Moore, Esq., and the Government of the Territory of Hawaii having been repre-

sented by F. E. Harvey Esq., special Sub-agent for the Commissioner of Public Lands for the Island of Kausi and surveyor in and for the Survey Department of said Territory; and all persons and parties present and represented at said hearing having agreed to the settlement of the boundaries of said lands as in said application prayed and as hereinafter set forth and certified to:

NOW THEREFORE, I, said Jacob Hardy, Commissioner of Boundaries for the Fifth Judicial Circuit of the Territory of Hawaii, do hereby find from all of the evidence and facts before me presented at said hearing that the just and true boundaries of said lands are, and I hereby declare and certify them to be, respectively as follows:-
